Flag Day

In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed June 14 as Flag Day. Pictured below is a poster commemorating the 140th anniversary of the adoption of the first flag of the United States, on June 14, 1777, by resolution of the Second Continental Congress.

In 1949, Congress passed legislation establishing National Flag Day. Many cities and towns have parades on Flag Day. Perhaps the largest parade is held each year in Troy, NY. A Presidential Order from President Eisenhower on August 31, 1959, after Hawaii was granted statehood, provided for the current design of our flag.
