## Supreme Chaplin's Challenge



#### This Month's Challenge March 2019

So he got up and went back to his father. While he was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him, and was filled with compassion. He ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him. (Gospel for Mar. 31, Lk 15:20)

My brother Knights, here we encounter upon some of the most stunningly beautiful words in the entire Gospel: the reunion of the prodigal son with his father. As Jesus describes the scene, I invite you to put yourself in three different sets of shoes. First, imagine that you are the father, seeing your own flesh and blood, your son, coming home. Second, imagine that you are the prodigal son, expecting the worst, but finding that your father is moved with compassion. Third, imagine that you are the hard-working older brother, watching this reunion from a critical distance. Becoming the man we are means that we can learn from all three: embracing others with the mercy of the father; running to our heavenly Father like the Prodigal, and with the older brother, hearing the father's words spoken to us—that "all that I have is yours'."

#### Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month I challenge you to be like the Prodigal Father by making the first move: take the first step toward another person in your life to encourage or forgive them. Secondly I challenge you to prayerfully write a list of things in your life for which you are grateful.

The deadline for implementing the use of the new Fourth Degree uniform has been extended to June 30, 2019. Due to a heavy demand for the new Fourth Degree uniform that has led to backlog in fulfilling orders, the deadline for mandatory use of the new uniform has been extended one year to June 30, 2019.

## **Membership News**

**Online Membership** – Supreme has initiated a new online process for practical Catholic gentlemen at least 18 years of age to join the Knights of Columbus. The intent is to streamline the joining process without changing membership requirements or eliminating degrees, councils, and council recruitment. Upon approval, these members will have full access to all benefits of the Knights of Columbus, pay an annual \$30 fee, and belong to the applicable State Council. Virginia went online January 16.

Members who join online will be issued a travel membership card from the State Council. This membership card grants the member access to any council event, **excluding** ceremonials and ceremonial discussions. Should a member that joins online decide to convert to local council membership, he may do so and be subjected to that council's admissions process. If granted admission into a local council, that member will then be allowed to experience the degree celebrations and pay the local council's dues going forward. Unlike traditional member transfers, the council that takes in an online member will be given credit for one new member and one new insurance member (if applicable).

## Editorial Comment and Reflection by J. Branco

### The 24 Hour Knight... the Service Call

The following quoted excerpt is a reprint from Supreme Council, editorial comment follows at the end of the excerpt.

"Imagine if you were able to tell a man that if he could just give 24 hours a year to the Knights of Columbus he could make a positive difference in his community and Church. Below is an illustration of just how little time it takes to be an active part of the Knights of Columbus:

12 hours a year reading the weekly parish bulletin, the state and local council newsletters, Columbia Magazine, and surfing the state council and Supreme Council Web sites.

- 2 hours a year volunteering at a council charity activity.
- 2 hours a year attending, with his family, two council religious activities.
- 2 hours a year on a council-sponsored Church, community, council family or youth project of his choosing.
- 2 hours a year attending one council meeting.
- 4 hours a year enjoying (again, with his entire family) a council social function such as a dinner, dance, picnic, etc."

We have all heard it before or are currently living it...I just don't have the time for the Knights right now. There are many reasons why this viewpoint/comment may be true. While it is understood that responsibilities to family, obligation to work place, or we think our lives are simply too busy right now are but a few of the constant calls on our time, the question remains so when would it be a good time for you?

Consider this for a moment, there are 8,760 hours in a year and by giving the Knights of Columbus 24 of those hours (equal to less than 0.3 percent), a man can be a better Catholic, a better father, a better husband, and a better person. Now think of the difference the Knights of Columbus has made in your life, in your community, and most importantly in our Church. As we all know time waits for no one, so I ask you again when would it be a good time for you?

Perhaps if you could consider "unplugging" for an hour and spending it in prayer or in joining in a special event with your Brothers who have not seen recently. Maybe consider reaching out to a Brother whom you know may not be as active at this moment and needs your invite to come back, Maybe it is seeking out a potential new Brother to join us, or maybe just maybe it is just spending time with a Brother who needs to know we are still here. I hope and pray that the value of the 24 Hour investment of time noted above begins to take shape with you that you realize it is time well spent. Scripture (Matthew 26: 31-35) provides us with a timeless lesson ..."before the cock crows three times,..." that we should reflect upon regarding our investment of time or more importantly why we cannot deny that call to service any longer.

#### **How to Pray the Rosary**

#### From the USCCB------HOW TO PRAY THE ROSARY-

The Rosary is a Scripture-based prayer. It begins with the *Apostles' Creed*, which summarizes the great mysteries of the Catholic faith. The *Dur Father*, which introduces each mystery, is from the Gospels. The first part of the *Hail Mary* is the angel's words announcing Christ's birth and Elizabeth's greeting to Mary. St. Pius V officially added the second part of the *Hail Mary*. The Mysteries of the Rosary center on the events of Christ's life. There are four sets of Mysteries: Joyful, Sorrowful, Glorious and—added by Pope John Paul II in 2002—the Luminous.

The repetition in the Rosary is meant to lead one into restful and contemplative prayer related to each Mystery. The gentle repetition of the words helps us to enter into the silence of our hearts, where Christ's spirit dwells. The Rosary can be said privately or with a group.

The Five Joyful Mysteries are traditionally prayed on the Mondays, Saturdays, and Sundays of Advent:

The Annunciation

The Visitation

The Nativity

The Presentation in the Temple

The Finding in the Temple

The Five Sorrowful Mysteries are traditionally prayed on the Tuesday, Friday, and Sundays of Lent:

The Agony in the Garden

The Scourging at the Pillar

The Crowning with Thorns

The Carrying of the Cross

The Crucifixion and Death

The Five Glorious Mysteries are traditionally prayed on the Wednesday and Sundays outside of Lent and Advent:

The Resurrection

The Ascension

The Descent of the Holy Spirit

The Institution of the Eucharist



#### Praying the Rosary

Make the Sign of the Cross.

Holding the Crucifix, say the Apostles' Creed.

On the first bead, say an *Our Father*.

Say three Hail Marys on each of the next three beads.

Say the *Glory Be* 

For each of the five decades, announce the Mystery, then say the \*Dur Father\*. While fingering each of the ten beads of the decade, next say ten \*Hail Marys\* while meditating on the Mystery. Then say a \*Blory Be\*. (After finishing each decade, some say the following prayer requested by the Blessed Virgin Mary at Fatima: "O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell, lead all souls to Heaven, especially those who have most need of your mercy.")

After saying the five decades, say the "Hail, Holy Queen, followed by this dialogue and prayer:

V. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God.

R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Let us pray: D God, whose Only Begotten Son, by his life, Death, and Resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life, grant, we beseech thee, that while meditating on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
