The council has received three thank you letters from all levels of Management at KNOM. The last letter was most interesting and I will try to highlight some of what Lynette Schmidt had to say.

**“Dear Joseph and Friends, Thank you so much for your most generous gift. (\$400) Your timing could not have been better! Just this week our news department broke the story of a 20% increase in electricity rates, effective immediately. That’s after a 20% increase just a few months ago at the beginning of the summer! Our listeners in the villages have it even harder – fuel prices are usually 50% higher in the more remote areas. It’s hard to do without light in the depth of Winter when it’s dark virtually all the time.....Last Winter, many hunters stayed closer to home for hunting, and cut down on snow machine use to check trap lines and crab pots. Nome Public Schools saw a spike in enrollment from children from the villages transferring to the city once the weather got cold.....Your gift will certainly help us to support the good folks of this region. ## **Know Your Officers**

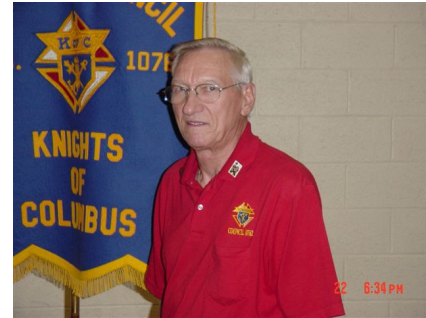
### **ADVOCATE**
