After I retired from LOTW in October 2012, I got invited by a friend to participate in the Denver Catholic Worker Soup Kitchen. This organization was founded by Dorothy Day in New York in 1933 and it is nationwide. Everyone involved In the Catholic Worker Soup Kitchen is a volunteer, from the delivery people, those preparing the food, servers, the Board of Directors...Everyone! NO one is paid! (Cont.) Unity

Funding comes from various churches (including LOTW) and other organization around Denver. I had no idea what this was all about, but I thought that this would be a good use of my retired time.

The first time that I participated, this is what I found. The first group of volunteers arrived at the Denver Inner City Parish at 1212 Mariposa around 9:00 am and stayed until about noon. Several other volunteers have already dropped off unsold vegetables, fruits and pastries from places like Starbucks, Sprouts, King Soopers, and Safeway. Also, meat is brought from the Food Bank of the Rockies or donated from some other source. A cook begins to prepare 45 gallons of soup from the donations, while the majority of volunteers prepare a green salad and a fruit salad. At 1:30 pm, a second group of volunteers transport the food down to the St. Francis Center on Curtis Street. A third group of volunteers set up the serving line at the center and, around 3:00 pm, they begin serving some 400 homeless Denver residents. By 4:30 pm, they are finished serving the guests at the St. Francis Center. If there are any leftovers, they are sent to New **Genesis Shelter for Men.** 

On the second Friday of each month, the Soup Kitchen receives a donation of very good chili... If there is a large donation of produce, some of it is frozen and the rest is donated to The Dolores Project, the Denver Inner City Parish food bank and/or the Denver Rescue Mission. The Soup Kitchen operates every Wednesday and Friday during the year (with the exception of the day after Thanksgiving).

(Note: Catholic Worker movement founder Dorothy Day was recognized by *Time* magazine as one of the most influential Catholics of the 20<sup>th</sup> century.)
