Council Social Meeting

Lecturer Rich Schick is pleased to announce that representatives of Samaritan House will speak at the council social on January 12. Samaritan House is one of the services provided by Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of Denver. Catholic Charities has served northern Colorado since 1927.

Samaritan House's origins go back to a cold winter night in 1981, when Fr. C.B. "Woody" Woodrich opened up Holy Ghost Church in downtown Denver to the homeless. He expected about a dozen people to sleep in the church; 200 showed up for shelter.

The efforts of Fr. Woody, Msgr. James Rasby and Archbishop James Casey led to the original Samaritan Shelter opening in the fall of 1982. Capuchin Fr. Bill Kraus was the first Director. The current Samaritan House building at 2301 Lawrence St. opened in November 1986.
