CHAPLAIN'S CORNER Fr. José Cortes

Monseñor Romero

May 23, 2015 was the beatification date for El Salvador's Archbishop Oscar Romero. He was Archbishop of San Salvador from 1977 until March 24, 1980, when he was shot while saying Mass at a San Salvador hospital. The beatification of Archbishop Romero will take place because his assassination was an act of hatred for the faith, a characteristic of martyrdom.

When Saint John Paul II visited El Salvador in 1983, he prayed at Romero's tomb, praising him as a "zealous pastor who tried to stop violence." Archbishop Vincenzo Paglia, the postulator of Archbishop Romero's cause, said: "Archbishop Romero was a pastor who gave his life for his people. He dedicated his life to helping, relieving and defending those who are poorest and who are weakest."

In the 1970s, El Salvador was marked by extreme economic inequality, resulting in an increase in protests and rebellions. These were met by government repression through death squads and forced disappearances. A civil war between military-led governments and left-wing guerilla groups began in 1979 and lasted until 1992.

In these very difficult circumstances, Archbishop Romero, as good shepherd of his sheep, had to defend his flock, who were many times victims of incredible violence. The dignity of the human person was not being respected. Thus, he had to raise his voice in defense of those who had no voice. In his last sermon he said: "Each week I go about the country listening to the cries of the people, their pain from so much crime, and the ignominy of so much violence. Each week I



Knights of Columbus An annual retirement survey released Tues-INSURANCE day makes clear, working longer often YOUR SHIELD FOR LIFF proves an elusive goal-and for many, it's Brian Graham: 301.962.0045 an unrealistic way to bail out a retirement savings deficit. "The odds are against"

those who want to work for pay in retirement, says Luke Vandermillen, a vice president at Principal Financial Group, a 401(k) administrator that partners with the nonprofit Employee Benefit Research Institute to produce the annual survey. A more realistic strategy, he adds, "is simply to save more." According to the survey, 67 percent of workers report that they or their spouses have saved for retirement, up from 64 percent in 2014. But only 22 percent are very confident that they will have enough money to live comfortably throughout retirement. Given that most feel their savings will fall short, it's not surprising that 67 percent of workers say they plan to work for pay in retirement. But here's why that may not be such a realistic plan: Among those who are already retired, only 23 percent actually work for pay. "People consistently overestimate their ability to work in retirement," says Vandermillen. Among the things that can cause people to leave the workforce earlier than they expect are health crises, layoffs and ageism on the part of prospective employers.

semi-private prayer and reflection. Just in front of the statue of the Blessed Virgin Mary is a table of candles and a stool for those who wish to kneel. The statue of Mary holds out her right hand toward you as if for a handshake. It is not at all unusual to see people light a candle, take the hand of the statue and hold it while saying a silent prayer and looking into the face of Mary. The room remains quiet, there is never a word spoken aloud, it is very reverent and holds a special meaning to many people.

Pope Francis is coming to the United States for a visit. He will be in Washington on September 24th where he has been invited to speak before the U.S. Congress by Rep. John Boehner. He will also celebrate Mass at the National Shrine where he is going to canonize Fr. Junipero Serra, the Spanish Franciscan priest, who in the 1760's brought the Catholic Faith to California and built a series of missions along the coast from San Diego to San Francisco. The Franciscan priests provided spiritual guidance as well as agricultural farms and vineyards to the people. The missions provided shelter to travelers and developed many craft, trade and leather works. His efforts improved the lives of the people and converted them to the Catholic Faith. Many of the original missions still exist as historic sites and are visited by many people. If you would like to see Pope Francis you should talk to your parish priest or contact Msgr.
