Fellow Knights: During February members of our council were able to give six donations. Thank you.

Last month's article dealt with the breaking down of complex sugars into glucose, the storage of glucose in the liver, and the regulation of blood glucose levels by hormones secreted by the pancreas. But just what should our glucose levels be? The answer to this question rather depends on the conditions in which you do the measuring.

There are two major testing methods: the fasting blood sugar (FBS) and the random blood sugar (RBS). The FBS is done after a person has not eaten for at least 8 hours. Normally after eating blood glucose levels with rise slightly and trigger an insulin response to bring the levels back to normal. The American Diabetes Association feels the normal FBS level is between 70 and 99 milligrams of glucose per deciliter (mg/dL) of blood. A RBS test, also known as a casual blood sugar test, does not require fasting. It is predicated on the idea that healthy people's blood glucose levels do not vary widely during the day, irrespective of when they ate.

FBS levels between 100 and 125 mg/dL may indicate a pre-diabetic condition; levels higher than 125 mg/dL indicate a diabetic condition. Additional testing will assist a physician in making the final diagnosis. These additional tests include: an oral glucose tolerance test for gestational diabetes, a Hemoglobin A1c test to see if medication dosage is correct, and a 2-hour postprandial blood sugar test to see if a diabetic is taking the correct amount of insulin. I left untreated, continuously high blood glucose levels can result in damage to your eyes, kidneys, nerves, and blood vessels over time.

If, however, the blood glucose levels are too low, a person may be experiencing hypoglycemia. In this condition, the blood glucose levels are too low to provide the necessary energy to sustain normal body functions. Mild symptoms include a jittery feeling, fast heartbeat, and cold/clammy skin. More moderate symptoms may include a short-temper, confusion, blurred vision, and unsteadiness. Severe symptoms include seizures, coma, and death. Sudden episodes of hypoglycemia can be treated in the short term by eating or drinking something with sugar in it.
