My Brothers,

I would like to describe the "Philos Project" and a related report supported by our Supreme Knight, Carl Anderson. This report as well as his testimony helped lead to a vote by the US House of Representatives, which has just passed a resolution by unanimous vote, 393 - 0, requesting that the US State Department declare that ISIS is practicing genocide against Christians and others in the region. The Pope and European Union have already determined a genocide is going on. After a lengthy delay, perhaps spurred to action because of this resolution, the US State Department has determined ISIS is in fact practicing genocide.

Here is a bit of background. In 1948 circumstances in Egypt led to the formation of The Muslim Brotherhood. Since then, many Islamic groups have formed in order to overthrow the existing rule and bring about "a more pure" practice of Islam. Until ISIS's Rise, Assyrian Christians and Muslims coexisted in relative peace. ISIS represents a marked departure from the recent Islamic regimes. At the hands of ISIS, non-Muslims, in particular Assyrian Christians, have been subjected to horrific instances of murder, burning, decapitation, torture, rape, slavery, kidnapping, and other depraved acts of wanton violence. ISIS has committed these heinous and inexcusable crimes in the name of ISIS's brand of Islam. ISIS has attempted to eliminate Christians from its territory and has systematically destroyed Christian symbols, buildings, and other aspects of Christian culture. The House resolution supports the notion that ISIS be prosecuted for war crimes, as defined by provisions developed by the United Nations of the Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of the Crime of Genocide. The European parliament has already taken a similar action. Evidence shows that past genocidal war crimes such as by the NAZIs against the Jews and others, in Rwanda against members of the Tutsi tribe, or in Cambodia by the Khmer Rouge have a great deal in common with ISIS practices. These comparisons are critical in judging a current genocide.

The Knights of Columbus Supreme Council has issued a report about this, and Supreme Knight, Carl Anderson has used the details in the report to testify to the US Congress in order to support efforts to end the genocide. Here is the internet address of the full report:

Apparently, the Houston TX.
