SANTA SAYS "IT IS NOT HOW MUCH MONEY YOU BUILD... IT IS HOW MUCH OF IT YOU KEEP!

The well known inspiration-strategist speaker "Tony Robbins" makes this statement in mastering today's financial money game. What is your hunger (he asks) in wanting to be financially independent throughout retirement?" Mr. Robbins has worked with just about every financial expert imaginable, from a minimum waged worker to Warren Buffet & Bill Gates. Taxes are the #1 concern!

The one financial matter every future retiree should deal with years before retiring, but doesn't, is the taxes he/she will pay out of their monthly pension incomes. What difference is there if you have say \$300,000 to \$400,000 dollars in pension funds and pay some 34% to 39% of it in Federal & State income taxes versus having \$200,000 and paying 5% to 10% in taxes? NOT MUCH! Diversifying some of your monthly savings contributions in an insurance based cash value program with tax-saving features is not only shrewd, but in fact what financial planners have been suggesting since the 2008 crash. Blood Bank Notes

Fellow Knights: I have been unable to get donor information from LifeStream for the month of October 2014; however, thank you to all who were able to give.

As we have learned, bone marrow and peripheral blood stem cells are two sources of blood-forming cells used in transplants. There is a third source: cord blood. As its name implies, it comes from a newborn baby's umbilical cord. Understandably, there are much less blood-forming cells in a unit of cord blood, thus these samples are more commonly used to treat smaller children than adults.

If a woman is expecting a child and wishes to contribute the cord blood, she should talk to her doctor between the 28th and 34th weeks of pregnancy. There is no cost for the donation but not all hospitals work with a cord blood bank. Upon collection, the cord blood will be evaluated for its number of blood-forming cells, tested for infectious diseases, and tissue typed to be placed on the registry. Privacy of the family will be insured by referencing the sample by number, not name. The sample will then be frozen in liquid nitrogen and stored.

Studies have shown that while a close match is most desired, cord blood does not need to match the patient as closely as with peripheral blood and bone marrow donors. Since it is stored in a public cord blood bank, it is readily available and does not need to undergo the extended testing of the prospective donor, which may take weeks or months.

More than 25 thousand patients around the world have received cord blood transplants. The are at least 193 thousand cord blood units listed in the Be The Match Registry. If you know of someone who is healthy and expecting, consider letting them know about this life-saving possibility. It's free and easy!

Chaplain's Corner - Fr. Romanus Ike

CELEBRATING THE REAL THANKSGIVING, ADVENT, AND CHRISTMAS:

As we approach the season of Thanksgiving, Advent and Christmas let us stop a moment and ask the question what does Thanksgiving mean to my family and me? What is Advent saying to us as children of God? And what is this Christmas celebration all about? Many people go through these events without meditation or reflection, therefore, they lose the real meaning of both Thanksgiving, Advent and Christmas. Many only look at them from the social point view, again, losing the spiritual heritage of these beautiful celebrations in our country. The heart of Thanksgiving is proclaimed in Psalm 95 thus:



Come, let us sing for joy to the LORD; let us shout aloud to the Rock of our salvation. Let us come before him with Thanksgiving and extol him with music and song. For the LORD is the great God, the great King above all gods. In his hand are the depths of the earth, and the mountain peaks belong to him. The sea is his, for he made it, and his hands formed the dry land. Come, let us bow down in worship, let us kneel before the LORD our Maker (ps.95:1-6).

Now during this season of Thanksgiving gather your family and proclaim to them the words of the Psalmist: let us shout aloud to the Rock of our Salvation, let us bow down in worship, let us kneel down before the Lord our Maker. It is necessary that we recognize God the Rock of our Salvation and our Maker. And thank Him for his goodness to us.

The word "Advent" comes from the Latin word 'adventus', which means "coming" or "visit." In the season with this name, we keep in mind both "advents" of Christ, the first in Bethlehem and the second yet to come. During Advent, we are reminded of how much we ourselves also need a Savior, and we look forward to our Savior's second coming even as we prepare to celebrate his first coming at Christmas. During this season some activities could help us realize a deeper meaning of Advent in our families. Activities like lighting the candles every Sunday with the whole family present, bible sharing and prayer sessions that brings out the meaning of Advent, that is: the nearness of God to every family.

Christ's birth is the celebration of the great Emmanuel (God is with us) mystery. And God is with us so that we may know that we are infinitely lovable. To come, as a baby was his first and greatest lesson to us, for it teaches us the most important lessons of all about God's attitude towards us. Christmas speaks peace to us and this is what St John Paul II tells us about Christmas:

Christmas is a mystery of peace! From the cave of Bethlehem there rises today an urgent appeal to the world not to yield to mistrust, suspicion and discouragement, even though the tragic reality of terrorism feeds uncertainties and fears. Believers of all religions, together with men and women of good will, by outlawing all forms of intolerance and discrimination, are called to build peace: in the Holy Land, above all, to put an end once and for all to the senseless spiral of blind violence, and in the Middle East, to extinguish the ominous smoldering of a conflict which, with the joint efforts of all, can be avoided; in Africa too, where devastating famines and tragic internal conflicts are aggravating the already precarious conditions of entire peoples, although here and there signs of hope are present; in Latin America, in Asia, in other parts of the world, where political, economic and social crises disturb the serenity of many families and nations. May humanity accept the Christmas message of peace!

I wish to summarize Christmas in the words of Steve Maraboli:

Want to keep Christ in Christmas? Feed the hungry, clothe the naked, forgive the guilty, welcome the unwanted, care for the ill, love your enemies, and do unto others as you would have done unto you.

I hereby call for the celebration of the real Thanksgiving, which actually means, thanking God the maker of us all. Advent: which really means Spiritual preparation for the coming of Christ the Lord. And the real Christmas: which is realized by our intimacy with Christ and care for the poor, the hungry, the guilty and the unwanted in the society. May God grant us all a happy celebration of Thanksgiving, advent and Christmas.

RECAP OF M/R DRIVE A COMPACING A COMPACINA


