Fellow Knights: Members of our council gave 6 donations during November and another 11 during the month of December. In all, we had 65 donations for 2014! May we continue to help those in need with our life-giving donations. Thank you.

It seems as though I have exhausted the LifeStream website as a source of material for my monthly articles, thus I will look to other blood-related topics. For starters, we will look into blood glucose levels and their relationship to our health. This issue will talk about how glucose gets into our bodies and why it is an important part of our diet.

When we hear the term 'sugar', many of us think of the sweetner we use for our foods and drinks. In the biochemistry field, there are many forms of sugar. The basic form of a sugar is called a monosaccharide. Two of these monosaccharides can link together to form disaccharides; one such disaccharide is common table sugar. Monosaccharides can also link to form large polysaccharides called starches. Mono-, di-, and polysaccharides are found in many of the foods we eat: fruits, vegetables, breads, legumes, potatoes, etc. Our bodies digest these foods by breaking them down to their basic building blocks, some of which are in a monosaccharide form. Many of these monosaccharides are then converted in our body to a specific form, glucose. This is because glucose is the primary source of energy for the cells in our bodies.

Each of our cells contains several internal compartments or organelles, one type of which is the mitochondrium. Since there are many of this organelle in each cell, it is usually referenced by it plural form, mitochondria. In fact, liver cells contain between 1000 and 1600 mitochondria, while other cells may have as many as 300,000! These mitochondria break down the monosaccharide into water and carbon dioxide, while generating the energy-containing molecules (ATP, NADH, and FADH2) that are used in other processes throughout the cell. Thus, the mitochondria are the power plants of the cell; glucose is the fuel. Next issue: glucose storage in cells.

You have no doubt been asked to do it in the past... and you immediately think you don't need it... Insurance policy reviews! After awhile as the years go by, the specifics of the coverage get lost or garbled in one's mind to where you are guessing what you have and how your coverage works, right?

Why would the average policyholder, who hasn't seen their agent in say 5-10 plus years, benefit in having their coverage reviewed? First of all, has your living expenses & debts come down, remained the same or risen since the last agent visit? IT (Information Technology) Update: Latest phone scams DGK Dominic Glass

I write from personal experience here, having both scenarios start to play out on me. My instincts kicked in immediately, but after some research found these all too common and wanting to warn you all. Just like the "Bruce is in a Mexican Prison" email a couple years ago, scammers have not let up and we can protect ourselves with information and trusting your gut. A reputable company will not call you, you have to call them. If it sounds too good or suspicious, IT IS!

Scam1: 'One Ring' wireless phone call.

Your mobile phone (sometimes home line) rings once, maybe twice, showing an out of area code, 649, 806,284... Something you clearly don't recognize. IF your quick enough, you may get nothing or a recorded message about some service you probably don't want. Typically you can not get it in time. They want you to call it back. Sometimes it will go to a message prompting another phone number or it routes directly to an international line. This is where they can bill your account for a very expensive 'connection fee' or 'minute charge'. If you get caught in this, you have some resources. Contact your phone company, they may help. Scam2: "I'm calling from Windows..."

Three times now, I have had a man with foreign accent call my home and state he was calling to help because my Windows computer sent them an error and that he would help me clear the virus. Funny, since I now have a MAC. In the article linked below, the reporters played along, knowing where this is going. Their end game is to get you to open remote access to your computer to them overseas. Then they can commonly steal data or lock your computer and you have to pay a 'ransom' to "fix" it. If you asked them simple specific questions about your computer like "Which IP are you referring to? I have 2 computers?" or "Is that the one named Family or my personal one?", they can not answer. A real IT remote link can tell you which computer they are looking at. Just tell them you are praying for their soul and hang up.

Chaplain's Corner - Fr. Romanus Ike

ON THE EPIPHANY OF CHRIST:

The wise men from the East, in their thirst for knowledge of God, willingly left everything, their home and country, in pursuit of that quest. In their diligent search they were led to the source of true knowledge - to Jesus Christ, the Light

and Wisdom of God. When they found the newborn King they humbly worshiped him and gave him gifts fitting for a king.

The example of the wise men is something every one of us should emulate especially this New Year. We are really challenged by them to seek and thirst for the knowledge of God in our life. We need to leave certain things aside to look for God and things related to Him. Like the wise men we need to offer him the gifts of our life and the best thing life has provided for us. They saw the star of Christ and interpreted correctly what the star is all about and followed the star to discover Christ.

According to Pope Francis in his Epiphany Homily 2015: It is the Holy Spirit who called them and prompted them to set out; during their journey they were also to have a personal encounter with the true God. Along the way, the wise men encountered many difficulties. Once they reached Jerusalem, they went to the palace of the king, for they thought it obvious that the new king would be born in the royal palace. There they lost sight of the star and met with a temptation, placed there by the devil: it was the deception of Herod. King Herod was interested in the child, not to worship him but to eliminate him. Herod is the powerful man who sees others only as rivals. Deep down, he also considers God a rival, indeed the most dangerous rival of all. In Herod's palace the wise men experience a moment of obscurity, of desolation, which they manage to overcome thanks to the prompting of the Holy Spirit, who speaks through the prophecies of sacred Scripture. These indicate that the Messiah is to be born in Bethlehem, the city of David.

At that point they resume their journey, and once more they see the star; the evangelist says that they "rejoiced exceedingly" (Mt 2:10). Coming to Bethlehem, they found "the child with Mary his mother" (Mt 2:11). After that of Jerusalem, this was their second great temptation: to reject this smallness. But instead, "they fell down and worshiped him", offering him their precious symbolic gifts. Again, it is the grace of the Holy Spirit, which assists them. We must be encouraged by their act of adoration for this New Year to increase our acts of adoration, worship and prayer to Christ,

For him the wise men entered into the mystery. They passed from human calculations to the mystery: this was their conversion. Can we enter the mystery of Christ for our own conversion? Let us ask the Lord to let us undergo that same journey of conversion experienced by the wise men. Let us ask him to protect us and to set us free from the temptations, which hide the star. To let us always feel the troubling question: "Where is the star?", whenever – amid the deceptions of this world – we lose sight of it. To let us know ever anew God's mystery, and not to be scandalized by the "sign" which points to "a babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger" (Lk 2:12), and to have the humility to ask the Mother, our Mother, to show him to us. To find the courage to be liberated from our illusions, our presumptions, our "lights", and to seek this courage in the humility of faith and in this way to encounter the Light, like the holy wise men. Amen.
