Have I been blind all my life?

I was taught decades ago to watch for deceit, which can take so many forms. False advertising, con games, twisting the meaning of another's words, hiding evidence, mis-stating facts, taking information out of context, framing an innocent person, making promises but never intending to keep them.

Our 8th Commandment: You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. Our Catholic teaching informs us this includes many situations, not just spreading incorrect evidence, or "witness against a neighbor". For example, "bearing false witness against your neighbor" covers any kind of falsehood: perjury, lying, slander, detraction, rash judgment, etc.

I am growing more concerned about evil things masquerading as good things, and of good things being cast as corrupt or evil. We are taught that one of the roles of Satan is "The Great Deceiver". The enemy of our Good Lord sets mental and/or emotional traps we humans are so vulnerable to fall for, and sadly even willingly accept. We love to rationalize our own bad behavior.

There is an easy read that can help us to understand the many types of deceit set before us. The book, The Screwtape Letters, is a fictional account of a senior devil named Screwtape, who is teaching a devil-in-training, Wormwood, how to trick human beings. It covers a great deal of temptations humans have faced throughout history. Many people have found it enlightening, and an aid in honestly examining our own consciences. It will not replace receiving the Sacraments, but it does provide clarity on many issues. Try reading it!
