I would like to start this report by announcing some important dates for the council members this month.





In an effort to practice good stewardship with our funds, the 2014-2015 Officers prepose the following budget.

Income was extrapolated based on 95% of averages for the last 5 years. Current line item amounts create a negative total, same as last 2 years.

The last column to show the percentage each Charity item was assigned, which could then be used to disseminate as a percentage of profits (after expenses and mandatory items per Supreme or By-law) by quarter.

Example: 1st Quarter profits \$10,000. Bible Study would earn \$60 and Pro-Life \$320.

COUNCIL FIELD AGENT REPORT

David Keeling, Council Field Agent

Have you ever talked to a person who suffered a disability at work, or outside of work, to where they could not perform their job responsibilities? Did they tell you how hard it was to qualify for long term Social Security disability when their Worker's Compensation or State Disability benefits ran out? Did they also tell you how hard it was financially to live on approximately 55% of their regular income while disabled?

2-important reasons why Knights of Columbus has its own disability insurance program: 1-out-of-every-3 workers suffers' a disability sometime in their career in the U.S. And, the #1 reason families lose their home is due to a disability suffered by the wage earner.

Would you say those are good enough reasons to look at purchasing a Knights of Columbus supplemental Disability Insurance program or, are you thinking this may be right for the other worker but it won't happen to me and my family? Blood Bank Notes

Fellow Knights: In March our group had 8 donations followed by 4 more in April! Thank you for all who have been able to participate in this life-giving process.

Continuing with the topics of cholesterol and lipids: Lipids (or fats) are essential molecules for our bodies, used in the construction of cells, hormones, and vitamins. They can also be used as a source of energy for our bodies (burning off fat) in a different manner than previously discussed with carbohydrates (sugars). Since our blood, cells, and intercellular fluids contain mostly water and fats are not soluble in water, it is difficult for lipids to freely move through our bodies without the help of other molecules, such as proteins. Many proteins can attach themselves to lipids and help move them through the blood stream. These complexes of fats and proteins are called 'lipoproteins'.

When health care providers test our blood to monitor our 'fat' levels, they usually order a lipid panel which determines our cholesterol level along with our 'high density' and 'low density' lipoprotein levels. Other terms commonly used are 'good cholesterol' (for high density lipoproteins or HDL) and 'bad cholesterol' (for low density lipoproteins or LDL), although cholesterol is not the only fat attached to these proteins.

A LDL particle is composed of 80 to 100 protein molecules which attach to as many as 3,000 to 6,000 lipid molecules. These are transported away from the liver to various tissue cells to allow for building of additional tissue, vitamins, and hormones. However, if LDL levels are too high, they can let go of the cholesterol which then sticks to the walls of blood vessels because it no longer has help in traveling through the water-based blood. There they become involved with white blood cells (WBCs) which over time can cause the artery walls to harden (atherosclerosis) and thicken (plaque buildup) if they are not removed. This condition may affect the blood flow, causing higher blood pressure readings. If the plaque material becomes dislodged, it may cause clots and lead to blockages in large and small blood vessels.

A HDL particle is also composed of 80 to 100 protein molecules attached to hundreds of lipid molecules. HDL particles are able to remove the LDL particle remnants and other cell debris away from blood vessel walls and transport them to the liver for removal from the body. Thus, high HDL levels may reduce the risk of heart disease and heart attacks. They may also reverse the effects of atherosclerosis

Next month: HDL, LDL, and cholesterol levels
