During this penitential season of Lent, culminating with Holy Week and the Solemnity of the Resurrection, we might want to consider a few items in our Lenten walk through the Valley of Death, sin and temptation in our lives.

Our separated friends who attend Protestant denominations correctly emphasize a "personal relationship" with Jesus, but in reality, there is nothing more Catholic than that because we receive the ultimate in personal relationship with Jesus when we receive Holy Communion which is the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Our Lord, and He then gives us His Holy Spirit and leads us to the Father, as well. What is more personal than that? Unfortunately, our separated bretheran's personal relationship is sought at the cost of doctrine, the One True Church founded by Jesus, authority, sacraments and relationship to Jesus and all His Family: His Mother, His Foster Father, and all of our older brothers and sisters in heaven, the Saints.

The four things that are within our grasp as Catholic men and women are: sanctifying grace, prayer, the sacraments, and doing our daily duty in our vocation.

Let me conclude by a reflection upon how we should worship God in our lives, especially during the Divine Liturgy, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Some Catholics, or those who have gone on vacation from going to Sunday Mass murmur that the Mass is boring or repetitive, or the music is poor and the sermons are worse. Stop and think about this very seriously. As an educator during my professional life, I know that students learn and retain only what is repetitive whether it be algebra, the periodic table of elements, conjugation of verbs, or any other difficult material.

"Take away the ceremonies from the Church, and you will straightaway destroy the WORSHIP OF GOD AMONG THE GREATER PART OF CHRISTIANS. Make sure no one raises their hands and hearts, or bends his knee, or strikes his breast, or bares his head to pray, or stands to hear the Gospel read, or does any similar thing, and you will see that within a few days, what we call devotion fades quite away. For the devotion which remains in the hearts of a few Christians, feeble spark of worship though it may be, is kept alive by ceremonies."

This is a quotation from the only bishop who did not cave in to the demand of King Henry VIII that all Catholics proclaim Henry was superior to the pope in England. Who is this canonized saint? Saint John Fisher of Rochester, England whom Henry the VIII beheaded.

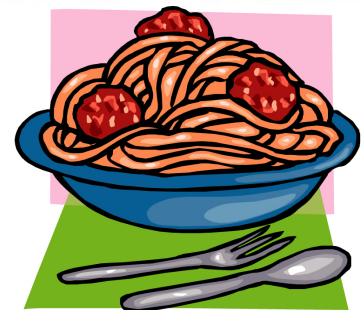
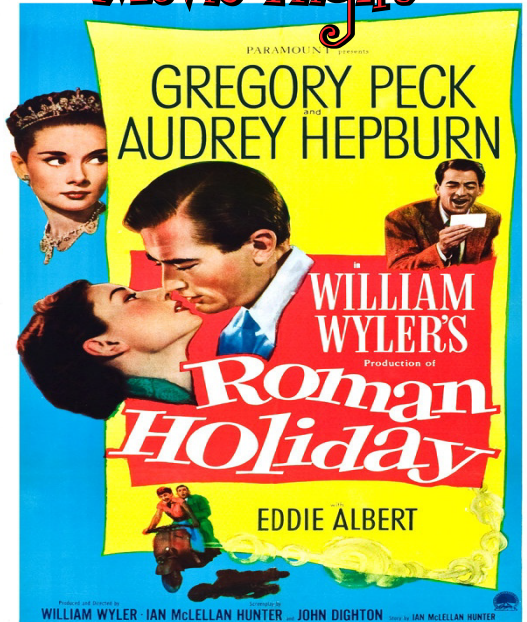

HR 492 – the Ultrasound Informed Consent Act.

HR 816 – the Life at Conception Act.

HR 1695 – Parental Notification and Intervention Act.

Another important bill which they should be supporting is H.R. 153. This has to do with restoring free speech to America's churches. SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. **Purpose:** The purpose of the Leroy Fischer Scholarship is to provide educational assistance and opportunities for Catholic graduating high school seniors pursuing a post-secondary or vocational education.
2. **Eligibility:** Any graduating high school senior who is a practicing Catholic and a member of a local church may submit for consideration a completed scholarship application form.
3. **Application forms:** Application forms are available at local parish offices and high school counseling offices by **March 1st 2016** and must be returned to the Scholarship chairman no later than **June 15th 2016**. Applications postmarked after the June 15th dateline will not be considered.
4. **Selection Criteria:** Applicants will be selected and awarded scholarships grants on a maximum of 25 points as follows:
 - a. **Academic Achievement** =10 points
 - i. Grade Point Average
 - ii. Evidence of good writing skills
 - b. **Extra-Curricular** = 5 points
 - i. (eg. Sports, Club, Parish Organizations, Knights of Columbus activities)
 - c. **Recommendations:** = 5 points
 - i. Two Letters of Recommendation from teacher, counselor or other (eg. priest, employer)
 - d. **Financial Need:** = 5 points
 - i. Statement of Fincancial Need

Notification: Dr. Luis Arciniega, Scholarship Chairman will inform each Applicant by e-mail or post-mail of the action the committee regarding the Scholarship application submitted for consideration.
