#### Tax Deferral and Beneficiaries

Brother Knights....I have a couple of things that I need to discuss here this month. Both are basic items but sometimes we forget about the basics. One has to do with your beneficiaries, whether on life insurance or on your annuities. When was the last time you checked and were reas-

sured that your plans will go where you want them to? How many of you have experienced a death in your family but never got around to reassessing your own beneficiaries?

The other item I would like you to consider is tax-deferred plans. All Our IRAs, our 401(k)s, 403(b)s are great plans to put-away money before taxes...when your tax rates are high.

Now that some of you are older and not earning the same as you were in "those days", maybe it is time to take advantage of your lower tax status and utilize some of that tax deferred money. Take advantage of this situation because if this gets left to your heirs, they will be subject to a much higher tax. Whether you intend to gift some of these proceeds, or simply live on them, it may be time to check out a structured settlement for yourself.....Give me a call

Sometimes it is easy to overlook the simplest of things. Take the beneficiaries on your life insurance policies. If your policy was applied-for and issued several years ago, it could be that the original designated beneficiary needs to be updated. If you bought the policy when you were single, for example, you may need to update beneficiaries to reflect your spouse, and children.

Most people list a primary beneficiary - that person is designated as  $1^{\text{st}}$  in line to receive policy proceeds. We also encourage the naming of a contingent beneficiary - an alternate person designated to receive policy proceeds, usually in the event that the original beneficiary predeceases the insured.

I call all of our policyholders for annual review appointments, usually near the anniversary date of your policy – the date it was originally issued. One of the matters that we'll review is the status of your beneficiary designations. If they need updating, I can complete the paperwork during that appointment.
