



After yet another successful sixth year, the Council will again be selling Football Mania tickets. Each ticket costs \$25 and the Council keeps 70% of the money we collect. Ticket holders receive a great collection of digital music downloads, and they are entered into the Football Mania sweepstakes where they can win \$1000s in cash prizes based on the results of the football teams printed on their sweepstakes game cards. All sweepstakes game cards have an equal chance to win prize money based on the performance of the random football teams printed on the back. Game cards contain 3 random teams in each of the 17 weeks of the pro football season (you get 3 new teams each week). To play the game, participants simply add up the points scored by their 3 teams. From the Chaplains Desk

Fides et Ratio

"Faith and reason are like two wings upon which the human spirit rises to the contemplation of truth; and **God** has placed in the human heart the desire to know the truth — in a word, to know himself — so that by knowing and loving God, men and women can come to the fullness of the truth about themselves" — St. Pope John Paul II

Last August I mused on the history of the 1918 pandemic which extended into 1919 (as our 2020 one extends through 2021). Now it's time to consider the *Ratio*.

Besides being a history nerd (Ancient Middle East [helps with understanding the Old Testament], Civil War), I'm also a science nerd (my dad never finished high school, but his being a detailed electrician inspired me to study physics). Here are a two virus facts.

In the August 2021 issue of *Scientific American* there is an article, <u>The Year Flu Disappeared</u>, which stated that because of all the social distancing, masks, and hand washing the normal every year flu cases have remained near zero. Not just us, but elsewhere in the world. Interesting ...
