
Good Job!

Christian Persecution is Still Alive

But the good news is that the Knights of Columbus is trying to make a difference. On August 11, the Supreme Council announced that it was establishing a fund to aid religious minorities. Our organization has pledged a half million dollars to the effort, and they are soliciting public contributions of a half million or more. Supreme Knight Carl Anderson said "The unprovoked and systematic persecution and violent elimination of Middle East Christians, as well as other minority groups, especially in Iraq, has created an enormous humanitarian crisis," He added, "Pope Francis has asked the world for prayers and support for those affected by this terrible persecution, and we are asking our members, and all people of good will, to pray for those persecuted and support efforts to assist them by donating to this fund."

Our organization has a long history of helping, in fact, it was born of a need by Fr. McGivney. That spirit of giving flows down to even our council. We regularly help at soup kitchens, we help boys fund Eagle Scout projects, we give our time to various Parish activities. In all the councils comprising the Supreme council, our organization has donated over \$170 million and more than 70 million hours of help to charitable, and humanitarian causes across the globe.
