



COUNCIL RECEIVES TRIPLE STAR AWARD

Knights Assist SVDP Holiday Meals

Father Boecker Council 6090 Knights assisted the Saint Vincent DePaul Society of St. Pius X parish with their Holiday Meals programs for the needy. On November 18th Frank Birner, Matt Koykar and John DeFalco travelled to the Northern Illinois Food Bank in Geneva, Il to pick up forty frozen turkeys, 200 pounds of russet and sweet potatoes and forty Holiday Meal boxes of side dishes for Thanksgiving Meals. These were unloaded in the Martha Room where SVDP volunteers later distributed them to forty families in need.



Similarly, on December 16th, Frank Birner, Steve Wallace and John DeFalco drove to NIFB to pick up forty main courses of either frozen turkeys, turkey breasts or hams. Again 200 pounds of russet potatoes and sweet potatoes were loaded. Twenty loaves of bread and forty Holiday Meal boxes rounded out the pick-up. The Knights unloaded the food for later distribution by Saint Vincent DePaul members to ensure forty families had a holiday meal to celebrate the birth of our Savior at their Christmas celebration. Once again two Catholic ministries worked together to assist our neighbors in need.


From the Deacon's Desk






