

Color Guard Procession at Special Olympics May 19, 2018





After a successful sixth year, the Council will again be selling Football Mania tickets. Each ticket costs \$25 and the Council keeps 70% of the money we collect. Ticket holders receive a great collection of digital music downloads, and they are entered into the Football Mania sweepstakes where they can win \$1000s in cash prizes based on the results of the football teams printed on their sweepstakes game cards. All sweepstakes game cards have an equal chance to win prize money based on the performance of the random football teams printed on the back. Game cards contain 3 random teams in each of the 17 weeks of the pro football season (you get 3 new teams each week). To play the game, participants simply add up the points scored by their 3 teams. Every week, the 16 highest scoring game cards, and the 3 lowest scoring game cards all win prizes. There are 4,960 unique game cards, each of which has a minimum 1 in 15.7 chance to win a prize during the season. To be eligible for all 17 weeks of the season, tickets have to be returned with payment by Thursday, August 30.

From the Chaplains Desk

Yá'át'ééh,

The 2018 Navajo Mission is now one for the books. Everyone got home safely. I would like to thank the Knights for their generous donation in making this mission possible.

The Diocese sponsors many missions. The goal of each mission is to assist the people we serve in what they would normally do for themselves or because of resources or ability no longer can do for themselves. We follow the path of Christ by incorporating Christ's teachings in our actions and words. We respect their culture always and ignore Hollywood stereotypes.

In the big picture, most of what a culture does is amoral. Showing a person respect is following Christ. How to show respect to one another is an established pattern in a culture. It may not be our cultural way.

Navajo men and women generally grow their hair long – they are not hippies. Navajos show their respect when you are speaking by not looking you in the eye – they are not being rude; all their energy is concentrated into hearing.

Our Lady of Fatima Catholic Church in Chinle, AZ is in the shape of a Navajo Hogan. The church has integrated Navajo symbols. The inner glass doors have etched images of male and female Yei – not gods, not saints, just symbols of Navajo holy people. The mission has many dedicated members, but what the mission needs are younger bodies, even younger than 50, maybe even 60, to carry on the outreach. The information nights for the 2019 Navajo mission will be in January and the mission is two weeks in early June. Sometimes a person must go beyond their normal life and see the world as Christ sees it.
