

Vocations

In a recent Gospel, a man ran up to Jesus and asks what he should do to "inherit eternal life". Jesus quizzed him on the law. The man even stated proudly that he has followed the law since his youth. Jesus tells the man to sell all and follow him. Man walks away because he had many possessions.

Let's face it. It doesn't matter what vocation you follow, if you want to do it correctly, then you will sell all. Focusing too much on possessions, power, and prestige and not on the details of your vocation affects priests, husbands, and single guys. Even Knights are susceptible.

One vocation is hurting these days – priesthood or religious life. The calling is out there, but the support is missing. Maybe there are too many distractions. Religion and the priesthood have gotten a bad rap in recent years. What can we do about it?

In general, pray that the call can overcome the noise. If you know someone, who is interested, then offer support. Remember that a vocation is personal, support is not selling merchandise or marketing. You're dealing with a soul. But don't be quiet in today's society. Not always an easy job.

Besides praying and working for religious vocations, keep fine tuning your vocation.
