

Vocation Raffle Funds Distribution

On August 18 twenty council members and families hosted a friendship Sunday and provided pastries and coffee to the parishioners. The Council also presented a check for \$5000 to Father Steve Borello director of the Diocese of Joliet Vocations Program to help support his Quo Vadis Program. The purpose is to promote Vocations in the Priesthood.

Quo Vadis is a 4 day/3 night camp led by the Diocesan Seminarians in Woodstock, IL. The camp offered dynamic talks, small group discussions, meaningful prayer experience, including Mass, the Liturgy of the Hours, and Eucharistic Adoration, with a dynamically fun environment including high ropes course, zip line, sports, games and more. The retreat was open to all 13-18 year old men and those attending had a life changing encounter with Christ while having a great time. It was attended by 35 young men and at least 10 filled out intent cards.







After yet another successful fifth year, the Council will again be selling Football Mania tickets. Each ticket costs \$25 and the Council keeps 70% of the money we collect. Ticket holders receive a great collection of digital music downloads, and they are entered into the Football Mania sweepstakes where they can win \$1000s in cash prizes based on the results of the football teams printed on their sweepstakes game cards. All sweepstakes game cards have an equal chance to win prize money based on the performance of the random football teams printed on the back. Game cards contain 3 random teams in each of the 17 weeks of the profootball season (you get 3 new teams each week). To play the game, participants simply add up the points scored by their 3 teams. Every week, the 16 highest scoring game cards, and the 3 lowest scoring game cards all win prizes. There are 4,960 unique game cards, each of which has a minimum 1 in 15.7 chance to win a prize during the season. To be eligible for all 17 weeks of the season, sold tickets #'s have to be returned by Thursday, September 5th, 2019.
