Once we have completed an initial successful pickup, the Township Highway Offices will have the sign created and positioned on Higgins Road.

This program will truly be a great contribution to the community and our council. It is equally important to note that the safety of our members is paramount to having a good time, working with fellow Knights, and enjoying the great outdoors. I would like to offer some of the following suggestions as we move forward with the program:

1. You should be in good health to participate, some of the terrain is hilly.
2. Proper preparation per the Safety guidelines is essential to your readiness. Please confirm (per instructions) you have watched the Safety video and read the Safety Guidelines.
3. The weather conditions may be sunny, hot, dry, buggy, possibly a little wet, consider this a 2-3 hour outdoor task, proper clothing and protection is key to your good health.
4. Per instructions, please bring a grab stick or broom handle with nail, to prevent excessive bending. A bucket can come in handy as well.

We are to meet up at the Woodfield IHOP (1700 E.Higgins Road, Schaumburg) at 8:30AM. Ideally, we sign off on waivers, distribute vests and bags (supplied by Village), and get on road by 9AM.

If you have a van or larger seating vehicle, we will not need as many vehicles to shuttle down the road.
