What We Wear . . . Why We Wear It

In centuries past, Knights were defenders of their countries and of the Catholic Faith.

Their code of chivalry and ours bade them to help the oppressed, the poor, and most particularly the widows and orphans.

A vigil would take place in the chapel of the castle. Here Knights told of their bravery, accomplishments and of their service to God and Country.

Our Cape is lined in red, displaying the emblem of the 4th Degree of our order. It is worn as a symbol of our dedicated service of our Church, and our fallen Brother Knights.

Our Rosary is symbolic of our dedication to our Blessed Mother and her Holy Cause to the service of her Divine Son.

Our White Gloves are symbolic of helping hands given to anyone in need.

Our Service Baldric, bears the colors of our Country's flag and displays the Emblem of our order.

Our Chapeau is worn with pride and used to honor those who serve the faith, which we hold so dear.

Our Sword which is no longer used in combat, but rather, as a symbol of our undying dedication as defenders of the Faith.

We, as Knights of Columbus, do not participate in physical combat. Rather, we are giving our lives to the Service of our Church, helping those in need, sharing with and caring for our Brother Knights and their Families, and respecting our Country and its Flag.

Our Knights of Columbus 4th Degree Regalia addresses these profound objectives of our departed Knights, who may or may not have died in combat. Their Knights of Columbus possessions/arms shall be divided among us Knights to be retained forever to be in our hearts and minds.


