St. Hubert GIFT Ministry, Hoffman Estates, the **G**row In Faith Together (**GIFT**) ministry took its name from the original curriculum book used at St. Hubert 36 years ago. GIFT focuses on Catholic religious education to those with intellectual disabilities. The curriculum also includes crafts, worksheets, crossword puzzles and related searches that enhance the learning experience.

Presently there are 46 students among four groups, ranging in age from 10 years to 70 plus. Students come from area facilities such as Clearbrook and Little City, as well as private homes.

Kathy Kramer continues to express appreciation for our ongoing generous GIFT contributions which help keep tuitions low, facilitate buying supplies, support the library and various other related functions.

Misericordia Home, Chicago, is a home for persons with mild to profound developmental disabilities. Established in 1954 by the Sisters of Mercy, the Home supports more than 600 children and adults.

Gigi's, Hoffman Estates, is a Down Syndrome Achievement Center. Its mission is to change our views of Down Syndrome. Free therapeutic and educational programs are offered to empower individuals with Down syndrome and their families.

The Knights of Columbus Newman Century Award Donor Program recognizes Knights who make a single donation and have arranged other significant contributions.


