Chaplain's Corner



Brother Knights,

Ten days ago, all of us received a letter from our Supreme Knight stating, "We have to extend our hands to our fellow Christians who are in dire need and severely suffering from violent persecution." This is in response to the call of Pope Francis that we Christians should not just remain 'complicit silent' in place; rather open our lives to refugees in order to end this crisis. Furthermore, Pope Francis asked every Catholic Church and the religious communities in Europe to take in a family of refugees as a concrete expression of the Gospel.

This is where the big question to all Christians comes into how they live their faith; hence how deep they knew Jesus and how true they follow Jesus. The Sunday Gospel (Sept.13, 2015) is a story wherein Jesus asked his disciples 'who do you say that I am?' and teaching that the real disciples are those who deny themselves, take up his cross and follow him. In other words, those who identified themselves as Christians should live-up and do the teaching of Jesus in their life. St. James followed-up that living faith must be authenticated with good works. It is not enough to wish someone well; it is necessary to attend to that person's need. Thus, faith without work is dead.
