SHIELD AWARD

The Shield Award is presented to local police for demonstrating exemplary conduct, integrity and professionalism.

A recent commendation was issued for life saving action taken by the below listed officers. On January 2, 2019 at 08:05AM Cedar Grove Police received a call reporting a man down at 317 Bowden Road. The first police units arrived in just over two minutes. Upon arrival they found a 50 year old male in the company of his young daughters slumped over turning blue. He was pulse less and not breathing. The Officer's initiated CPR, deployed the LUCAS Device and AED. Shocks were delivered, along with the CPR, the patient regained a pulse and began breathing. The Officer's continued to treat the patient. ALS/BLS arrived and took over care. He was subsequently transported to a local hospital. The gentleman was hospitalized in serious condition however he was expected to and did recover. The Officer's swift actions from the original call, to arrival and CPR resulted in a lifesaving action.
