As part of a national effort by the Knights of Columbus to provide coats for kids in low-income families, KC Council 8482 at Prince of Peace provided 70 coats. On a local level, the Council provided an additional 45 coats to Resurrection Parish that were distributed on the same day as gifts from Prince of Peace parishioners as part of the Christmas Adopt a Family program for needy families in the community. Business Meetings to be Held at POP

Just recently the Archdiocese and his Eminence, Cardinal DiNardo have opened up parishes to allow for the various Parish Ministries to once again hold meetings at their parishes, HOWEV-ER, under certain qualifying guidelines that follow our Archdiocese, State and National guidelines. We now have permission to hold our monthly Business Meetings in the Community Center as we had begun doing in the pre COVID -19 past (2019). So, we are excited to announce that our Wednesday evening January 6th monthly meeting will be held at the Prince of Peace Community Center, with a pre-boxed meal beginning at 6:00 pm and the meeting to begin at 6:30 pm.

The guidelines set up, in this regard, by our Parish Operations group and Pastor call for us (KofC) to thoroughly sanitize the meeting room and furniture both before and after the meetings. We have been doing this at the Hall with hospital grade sanitization products. Masks must be worn, except when eating, and we will observe the proper social distancing protocols.

This is a big room and we should not have a problem hosting 50 to 60 men for the meal and meeting. Our Parish will confirm to us, this week, the number of members that we will be allowed to have present. Watch your emails.

Council meetings are a key part of a Knight's experience.

These meetings should respect the valuable time of our members. Outdated, wasteful practices must be replaced by relevant, motivating meeting agendas that fully engage attendees.

The Fraternal Mission staff did an extensive review of Council meetings including a survey with feedback from nearly 55,000 members. The outcome of this careful research is a new set of guidelines and agendas for Council meetings that reflect what Knights want and need.

Section 124 of the Charter, Constitution and Laws of the Knights of Columbus, requires each subordinate Council to hold at least two regular meetings each month. One is a Council meeting for all members. The purpose of this meeting is to build fraternal spirit, to share information, to strengthen formation in the faith, and to present matters that require the vote of Council members.

The other monthly meeting is an Officers' Planning meeting. The purpose of this meeting is to plan programs, develop budgets, pay approved bills, prepare motions, discuss new ideas, and deal with other necessary matters. Council officers, directors, and chairpersons are required to attend this meeting. This meeting is open to any Council members who wish to attend.

The new guidelines for Council meetings will go into effect at the January business meeting.

My brother Knights, all your officers and trustees are excited to welcome you back to our meetings at the parish!

Monthly Tamale Sales By Brian Gray

Brother Knights,

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year! Below is the December 2020 Tamale Sales reports and 2020 Sales Summary. December was a big success for tamale sales. We delivered 364 dozen tamales to about 117 homes across the greater Houston area. Both pre-sale orders at the church



and online orders were taken. We netted \$1,456.00 in sales profit and \$505.00 in donations. With \$154.34 in fees taken out, our total profit for December was \$1,806.66.

A brief recap of the year would show that we held 3 tamale sales events at the church before they were cancelled in March due to COVID-19. We missed one month of sales in April until we re-grouped and started selling online only orders for delivery in May. By November, we were back at the church getting the word out with pre-sale orders as well as continuing online orders. We've had success in advertising in the parish bulletin and on the Parish Facebook page. We encourage anyone to share the <u>www.KofC8482.org</u> website link to their social media page as well as neighborhood and community pages. In 2020, we netted \$8,101.71 in profit, which is nearly 50% of our annual goal. All told, this is a welcome amount considering all the adjustments that have been made. I believe there is an opportunity to continue to grow next year's sales with more awareness among parishioners, friends and neighbors.

Seventeen Knights or family members generously donated their time to church pre-sale orders and deliveries. Thank you to all the Knights who have supported the tamale sales and delivery to make this a success – we could not succeed without you! A special thank you also to our webmaster **Dave Wimberly** who keeps things running smooth through the PayPal ordering system!

Adopt-A-Family by Brian Gray

At the November business meeting this year, our Council voted to adopt two large families for the Prince of Peace Adopt-A-Family Christmas gift giving program that is run through the Mercy Center. As soon as the vote passed, our brother Knights immediately went to work by donating in a pass-the-hat offering at the meeting. A few days later, adoptions requests were submitted online to the Mercy Center at the earliest time available, and our Council was provided with two large families, each with 5 children ranging in age from 6 to 14 years old. Email appeals were sent to our Council members and many

brother Knights responded with a desire to adopt a child or to provide family gifts or donations for grocery and spending money. All the children were adopted and all the family gifts and grocery gift cards were provided, making it very easy on our program coordinator not to have to do any shopping or gift wrapping. In addition to the traditional donation methods of cash, check and gift cards, a PayPal site was setup to receive online donations. Because of the many generous offerings by our brother Knights, we provided each family with \$300 in Visa gift cards in addition to fulfilling all the gift and grocery needs for both families! The gifts were delivered to me as the program coordinator a week in advance of their delivery time to the Parish. My wife and I brought the boxes of gifts to the parish during the outdoor drop off event on the morning of December 19th, between rainstorms.

This year's Adopt-A-Family program was a success for our Council to provide Christmas gifts for two large families, plus generous gift card donations. One challenge that we did have was that the family information forms had no information on the children's sizes or gift preferences, so, our brother Knights did the best they could to provide gifts that the families would enjoy. I would like to thank our brother Knights and the former program directors before me who make this program a success for our Council year after year.

CANDIDATE INFORMATION

This Exemplification Class will be a combined Virtual and In-Person ceremony. Candidates must be Third Degree members in good standing with the Knights of Columbus.

The Exemplification fee is **\$50.00**. This includes the initiation fee. Social Baldric. certificate mailing and Fourth Degree lapel pin. The exemplification fee for a priest, deacon or seminarian is \$30.00. The candidate may purchase the optional sword package for an additional \$215.00 which includes an etched sword, scabbard, carrying case and service baldric. Candidate "no-shows" without a six (6) day advance notice to the District Master will be assessed \$40.00 for his exemplification fee. Priests are exempt from this assessment.

The recommended dress for those joining virtually is your Sunday best.

Those who choose to join in person have a choice of three dress options as described below -

1) A dark business suit (black, gray or navy) with a plain white shirt (no buttondown collar), dark subdued long necktie, black belt, dark socks, black plain toe shoes (no boots) and white gloves.

2) The uniform of the Fourth Degree. This is available online at https:// www.kofcuniform.com

The uniform package includes the official tie of the 4th Degree. This should be worn with a plain white shirt (no button-down collar), black belt, dark socks, black plain toe shoes (no boots) and white gloves.

3) A black tuxedo with a plain white shirt (no wing-type or button-down collar), dark subdued long necktie or bowtie, dark socks, black plain toe shoes (no boots) and white gloves.

If joining in person, Priests and Transitional Deacons should wear clerical attire. Candidates currently on active military duty may wear their Class A dress uniform.
