My fellow Brother Knights,

I recently attended the 2nd annual Grand Knight University and I am proud to announce I graduated in the top 25 (there were 26 new Grand Knights in the class). That being said, there were a couple of key takeaways from the day; our state charity goal and membership.



Our State Charity goal was \$4,680 and we gave \$4,840. That is 103% of our goal. Way to go!! Because of your generosity, we exceeded our goal. In case you don't know, 70% of all that we donate to the State Charity fund comes back directly to the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston. This money is used to support Catholic schools throughout the diocese.

Our Council's membership goal for the 2019/2020 fraternal year was to recruit 33 new members. We recruited 2 new members. If you do the math, we achieved 6.06% of our membership goal. 

AROUND THE HALL By Richard Carter

As part of the process to securing our Certificate of Compliance from Harris County, the Fire Marshall conducted an inspection and gave us a list of six items to correct. A key box was installed at the front gate to allow emergency entrance to the Fire Department. Handicapped lanes were painted in front of the building along with the signs. The biggest project was painting fire lanes along the driveway and on the parking lot. The Home Association decided we also wanted to power wash the all the concrete before painting parking spaces. We solicited three bids and settled on G-Force. They are a veteran owned business just starting out a franchise here in Houston. Brother **Randy Schliesman** donated a trailer mounted commercial 3500 psi concrete washer that heated the water to 200 degrees. That combination did a far better job that the portable models available from Home Depot. Still with over 38,000 sq. ft. of concrete it took over 120 man hours over three days to complete the task.

Thank you to Larry LaHaie, Bill Vasek, Ed Carney, Bob Chaya, Smitty Schmidt, and Isidor Padilla for donating their time to this project. The center picture below shows how dirty the parking lot had gotten since it was poured years ago.

- 1. **MEMBERSHIP CARD COST**: Membership Card is \$10.00. Purchase of the Membership Card automatically enters you into the Football Frenzy Game
- 2. **TEAMS:** There are 32 football teams. Football Frenzy tickets have 4 teams each week, and the 4 teams change weekly. No two tickets have the same 4 teams each week. Team codes are listed on the back of the ticket

SAVING THE STATUE

A 7' tall, half-ton bronze statue of **Christopher Columbus** in Bell Park was commissioned by the Italian/American Organizations of Greater Houston, Inc., and was brought to fruition by Houston native **Joe L. Incrapera**. It was donated to the City by the federation on October 11, 1992, the day before the 500th anniversary of **Columbus'** discovery of the Americas.

The statue was vandalized last month and removed from the park.

The Galveston/Houston Knights of Columbus, working with Mayor Sylvester **Turner's** office, will have the statue's broken arm repaired by **Mr. Incrapera** and stored at a K of C Hall in the Archdiocese.

We are all aware of the troubling events that are occurring today, including attacks on statues of historical figures such as Abraham Lincoln, Frederick Douglass and

our Order's namesake, Christopher Columbus. Statues of saints have also been vandalized, including those honoring St. Junípero Serra, St. Louis and even the Blessed Virgin Mary, and houses of worship and other religious symbols have been attacked. These are not merely attacks on statues and history. They are increasingly attacks on Catholics and people of faith

In the late 19th century, the Knights of Columbus took its name at a time of intense anti-Catholicism. Our founding members wanted to show that Catholics played an essential role in the exploration and development of America since its earliest days, and that a Catholic could be both a good citizen and a good Catholic.

However, anti-Catholicism persisted. In the 1920s, the Ku Klux Klan tried to stop Columbus Day celebrations and opposed Columbus statues simply because Columbus was a Catholic. We opposed the KKK then and have continued to stand up against bigotry directed at Catholics and others.

We stood up against the persecution of Catholics in Mexico in the 1920s, spoke out for the Jews of Germany in the 1930s and worked for religious freedom behind the Iron Curtain during the Cold War. Today, we are rebuilding Christian communities in the Middle East that were targeted for genocide. Each of us can be proud of our history of standing up for the most vulnerable among us.

While our faith calls us to be respectful of different perspectives, acts of vandalism are crimes against all who cherish democracy and mutual respect. The Knights of Columbus remains firm in its condemnation of all forms of racism and violence, including political violence. With churches, statues, and religious symbols subject to vandalism and attack, we call upon elected officials and leaders at every level to defend the religious freedom of all.


