The Spiritual Corner

I would like to tell you about a former student of mine who I will call Jim. His brothers and sisters were all above average in intelligence but unfortunately they all had a great disdain for learning. They all had a penchant for doing drugs and alcohol and frequent run-ins with the law. Jim's older brother was retained 3 times in the 7th grade. He guit school at the age of 16 without graduating from the 8th grade. Jim was no exception. He was left back in 7th grade but managed to make it to the High School. It was at the end of his senior year in high school that I saw Jim for the first time in four years. It was a good thing that he approached me because I never would have recognized him. A sport shirt replaced the leather jacket that he always wore. His hair was no longer long and unkempt. It was short and neatly combed. Because his brother was facing 10 yrs. in prison, Jim decided to turn his life around. He was now an honor student, vice president of the senior class and a member of the football team. After graduation he was going to do a stint in the Air Force and eventually go to college. But his turnaround came at a price. His brothers and sisters no longer talked to him. They couldn't accept his transformation. How dare he be different from them? Did he think he was better then them? You would think that they would have been happy for his transformation. It should have been motivation for them to turn their lives around. Instead they were envious and jealous. They refused to see their brother as he was. To them he would always be the young tough who was always drinking and drugging and in trouble with the law. In the words of William Shakespeare in his play The Merry Wives of Windsor "Familiarity Breeds Contempt".

The Gospel of Mark tells us that Jesus retuned to His hometown of Nazareth His neighbors and relatives had heard of his miracles. At first, when He began preaching in the temple, they were amazed. Where did He get such knowledge? But then their attitude changed. Is he not the carpenter? Is he not the son of Mary? He was just a carpenter what right did He have to teach us. They did not recognize Jesus as the Messiah. They couldn't even accept Him as a rabbi. They were totally blind to who he was. What should have been a moment of great faith had turned to envy and jealousy. **Their faith is so weak that Jesus could only perform a few miracles.** There is a lesson to be learned from this gospel that has to do with our preconceptions and our attitudes. If we see Jesus only as our savior and do not follow His way of love for all creation, our faith is weakened. If we allow our preconceptions to influence the way we treat others, our faith is weakened. If we don't use the gifts that God has given us, our faith is weakened. We become like the people of Nazareth and as we saw in Mark's gospel little if anything can be accomplished without faith..
