A reflection in anticpation of the coming season of Lent

A number of years ago an elderly man with a huge ego invited about ten friends to go to the art museum with him. He couldn't wait to bring attention to himself by flaunting his expertise as an art critic in front of his friends. In his haste to make himself the center of attraction the near sighted old man left his glasses behind.

Noticing a frame in front of him he approached the front of the gallery with all of his friends. He began his criticism of the figure in front of him. As he spoke more and more people gathered around him. "That frame," he said, " does not go with the background. The subject itself is extremely ugly and does not belong as the subject of art. The artist should have chosen a face that shows some integrity." His wife who had been trying to work her way through the crowd finally reached him and said very quietly, Dear, you are standing in front of a mirror."

The gospel for Ash Wednesday is about people like that. The Pharisees focused on themselves while they were praying, helping the poor or fasting. They were doing good things with their focus in the wrong place. Their focus should have been on God. Lent as we all know is a time of prayer, fasting and giving to the poor and we should continue to do those things. But it is also a period of conversion, a period of change, a time of turning away from sin and being faithful to the Gospel. We can begin our conversion by changing our focus from ourselves to God. It's something that we can do without much disruption in our daily life. We can begin each day by telling God that we offer all our prayers, good works, joys and sufferings to Him. When we pray, pray with sincerity and feeling. Talk to God as if he were a friend. As we go about our busy lives make a conscious effort to see and feel God's presence. If we help someone in need because we feel sorry for them remember that the compassion we feel is the presence of God in our life telling us to help. If we are good at something and get a feeling of accomplishment thank God for giving us that gift. If we help the poor try to see the suffering Christ in their eyes. If we are at work or at school and someone annoys us and we hold our temper because it might cause trouble if we don't try to remember that they are also creatures of God and He wants us to love and respect them. By making God our focus and bringing Him into our lives we will turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel.
