The Spiritual Corner

There is a story about a prominent family who sought the services of a man who was both a genealogist and a writer. They wanted him to write a family history but they warned him of an uncle who died in the electric chair. "Don't worry", he said, "I can handle it. I'll merely say that he held a seat of applied electricity in a famous government institution and that his death came as a real shock." You might say that he was trying to rewrite the family's heritage. Our heritage is part of who we are. We shouldn't change it.

When I was a kid people would ask me about my family heritage. I knew my mother was Irish but I didn't even know what kind of a name Kopcak was. A number of years ago I decided to investigate my heritage. After years of research I discovered that my grandfather was born in the town of Fetekekut in Austria-Hungary. Today it is called Sambron and is in the country of Slovakia. My grandmother's parents were from Drienov located in the country of Slovakia. Through research I learned that life was very hard and that the average life span for a male in Slovakia in the 1880's was only 31 years. So they came to the USA. Both my grandfather and my great grandfather worked 12 hours a day in the coal mines of Pennsylvania. Life was not easy. One thing that they held on to steadfastly was their faith.

The Irish side of the family was not much different except for the country of origin. The first Donovan came here in 1849 during the height of the potato famine. My 2nd great grandfather sailed from Cork Ireland on what was called a "famine ship". Again times were hard but their faith gave them the strength to persevere. No one can take this ancestry away. Not from me or you or any of us. That is why we celebrate St Patrick's Day, Columbus Day, Puerto Rico Day, African American day etc, etc.

In the Gospel of Matthew the ancestry of Jesus is traced back to David. David's kingship finds its fulfillment when Mary gives birth to Jesus. Jesus rules over a Kingdom with no end, the kingdom of God. As followers of Jesus His ancestry becomes our spiritual lineage. It is as much a part of who we are as our genealogical ancestry. But there is one thing that has been bothering me for several years. It has to do with our heritage. Suppose the celebration of St Patrick's Day or Puerto Rican Day or Afro-American Day was all lumped together as People's Day. How would we feel about that? Yet this is the very thing that is happening to the heritage of Christmas. Just the other day I heard the words to "We wish you a Merry Christmas" changed to "We wish you a Happy Holiday." I think things have gone too far. Some people blame the liberals. Some blame commercialism. But we have no one to blame but ourselves. We let it happen. How do we prepare for the coming of Christmas? We kick off the Christmas season by pushing and shoving each other on Black Friday. We run around shopping here, shopping there. We get angry with the people while driving. We get angry with the people in the store. We get angry with the clerks in the store. We worry about this and that. We get so wrapped up in the commercialism that we focus on **the word Christmas not its meaning**. We have to take a step back and ask ourselves if we are acting like Christians. Are we showing other people the God that dwells within us? Do we buy and send Christmas cards that reflect the meaning of Christmas. If someone wishes us a Happy holiday do we wish him or her a **Merry Christmas**? If they are Jewish do wish them a Happy Chanukah? If they are Moslem do we wish them a Blessed Ramadan. Let us keep God in Christmas. Lets not rewrite our heritage like the man in the story. Let us nourish it, and keep it, and pass it on to our children and grandchildren.
