#### Supporting Pro Life...

Hi All! First, here are some statistics, from lifenews.com, which is a great website...

"The United States marked 40 years of legalized abortion in all fifty states at any time for any reason throughout pregnancy on January 22nd, the anniversary of the Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision. Since that time, there have been approximately 55,772,015 abortions that have destroyed the lives of unborn children.

The best estimate for the current number of annual abortions in the United States — involving both the surgical abortion procedure as well as the dangerous abortion drug RU 486 — is 1.2 million.

This number means that there are about 3,300 abortions daily and 137 abortions per hour every hour in the United States.

This means that on average, an abortion is done every 30 seconds in the United States."

As I reflect on these numbers, it's hard to believe that our great country has allowed this to occur. Each of us was once at the point one week before our birth, usually 39 weeks after our conception. Is there any doubt that each of us was a human being at that point? Well, for the last 40 years, it has been quote "legal" unquote to end such a human life. But does our Creator approve of this? If not, then such a "law" is no good, and eventually, it will be changed.

When our U.S. Constitution was signed, it was "legal" to buy and sell human beings. It took almost 80 years, but we eventually abolished slavery. The same thing will happen with abortion, when enough people have the knowledge and the courage to voice their opposition. Fortunately, more and more people today are displaying such courage.

Below are some pictures from a recent demonstration in Chicago, organized by Eric Sheidler of the Pro-Life Action League. It started at Federal Plaza, with hundreds marching up the middle of Dearborn Street, and ending at Daley Plaza, where several great speakers were heard, including Fr. Rocky Hoffman.





Speaking of serious demonstrating, our Council was proud to once again sponsor a bus to the March For Life in Washington, D.C. on January 25<sup>th</sup>. Over 600,000 people were there to voice their opposition to our current "laws", and to promote a culture of life.

We need to increase respect for the essential nature of the traditional family, which provides the most stable environment for bringing children into the world and for nurturing them. There are exceptions to every rule, but as a rule, government or volunteer programs will not do as good a job as biological fathers and mothers will do.

We continue to support the wonderful work of the Women's Centers in our area. We need to provide some help for women who are struggling with an unplanned pregnancy, to give them some practical support, making it easier for them to choose life.

On March 23, at 7pm, there will be a Celebrate Life Banquet, at Bobak's Signature Events in Woodridge, to benefit Waterleaf Women's Center in Aurora, and also the McGivney Center of Hope and Healing in Chicago. Bishop Siegel will speak, along with Relevant Radio talk show host Drew Mariani. It promises to be a great event!! God bless!!
