Honor Flight of South Carolina

Mission and History

Honor Flight of South Carolina is a "hub" of the Honor Flight Network and was founded by Bill Dukes in July 2008. Earl Morse in Ohio founded the Honor Flight Network in 2004. The first flight for WWII veterans from South Carolina was in 2007 and organized by the mayor of Simpsonville. There are now four groups in South Carolina that are participating in the Honor Flight program – Columbia, Charleston, Greenville-Spartanburg and Myrtle Beach.

A charter flight takes the WWII Veterans to Washington, DC so that they can see and experience their WWII Memorial. They also enjoy a tour of DC and visits to the Korean, Vietnam and Iwo Jima memorials and monuments. The WWII Veterans are also special guest at Arlington Cemetery and they observe the Changing of The Guard at the Tomb of The Unknown Soldier. WWII Veterans do not pay for the one-day trip.

Guardians accompany the WWII Veterans on the flights and those wishing to be a guardian pay \$500 for the honor of being a caretaker for the WWII Veterans. Medical personnel are also part of the travel group.

The goal of Honor Flight of SC is to provide an opportunity for every WWII Veteran in South Carolina who has never had a chance to visit their Memorial an opportunity to do so.

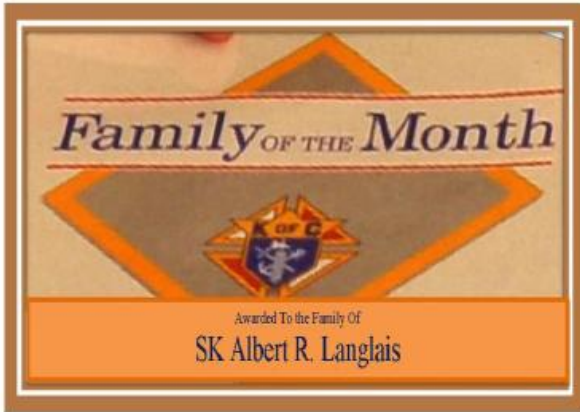

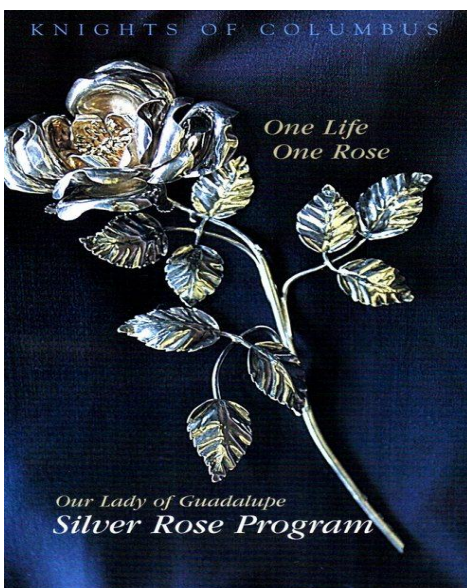
Beginning in April 2015, six Silver Roses will begin their journey across North America, from Canada to the United States to Mexico. The 2015 Our Lady of Guadalupe Silver Rose - One Life, One Rose Program will conclude on December 12, 2015 on the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas, at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey, Mexico.

2015 marks the 55th year of the program which began in 1960 as a project of the Columbian Squires of North America to honor the Blessed Virgin under her title of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas. The program has continued since then as a project of Columbian Squires circles, councils and Fourth Degree assemblies in several jurisdictions.

In 2001 Supreme Knight Carl Anderson expanded the program by beginning the "Running of the Rose" from the 119th Annual Meeting of the Supreme Council in Toronto. This is "a perfect program for the Knights of Columbus," said Supreme Knight Anderson. "Through it we honor not only Our Lady of Guadalupe and express the unity of the Order, but we also reaffirm the Order's dedication to the sanctity of human life. It is to the Blessed Mother that we turn in prayer as we work to end the Culture of Death that grips our society. As we think in terms of 'One Life, One Rose,' it is most appropriate that we turn to Our Lady of Guadalupe who made known her will through Juan Diego and the miracle of the roses."

Today six Silver Roses travel through North America exemplifying Knights of Columbus devotion to Our Lady and commitment to the Culture of Life.

In 2015, one Rose begins in British Columbia and heads south along the Pacific coast before turning east on a winding path through the southwest and mountain states before reaching Texas. A second rose starts in Alberta and heads east to Saskatchewan before entering the United States in North Dakota and travelling through the northern US Rockies and the Great Plains on its way toward Texas. A third rose starts its run in Manitoba, moving south through the central United States and along the Mississippi before turning to Texas. A fourth Rose begins its journey in Ontario moving through the Midwest and some of the Mid-Atlantic States before ending in Washington, D.C. A fifth Rose begins in Virginia and journeys throughout the south on its way to Texas. A sixth Rose starts in New Brunswick and travels throughout the northeast, completing its journey in Connecticut. The program ends on Dec. 12, 2015, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

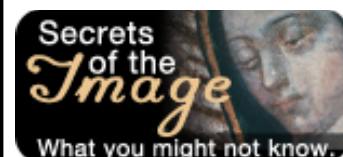

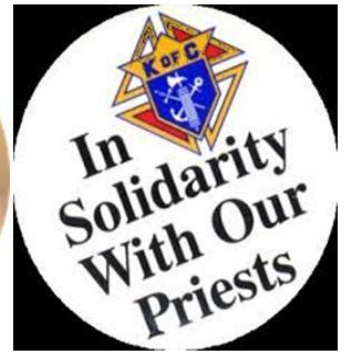

As you know, our country has suffered legalized abortion for over 40 years. St. Joseph is a model for men

FORT MILL—Becoming a better Catholic man means turning away from the secular world and toward Christ.

Hundreds of men of all ages listened to two priests and a former football coach who laid out effective guidelines for incorporating God into every facet of their lives during the South Carolina Catholic Men's Conference.

The March 7 event took place at St. Philip Neri Church and was sponsored by the South Carolina State Council of the Knights of Columbus, with support from the Diocese of Charleston.

The day included time for prayer and confession, with Mass celebrated by Bishop Robert E. Guglielmo, and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament led by Father Gregory Wilson.

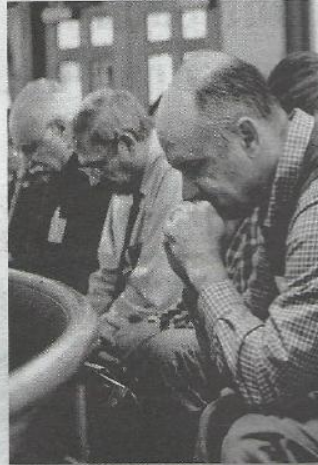
Franciscan Father Paul Williams talked about St. Joseph and how he still sets a good example today. Father Williams, who spent 26 years at South Carolina parishes, is pastor of St. Joseph Church in Wilmington, Delaware.

Father Williams equated St. Joseph's role in the Holy Family to that of the husbands and fathers present.

"You are to be their St. Joseph," he told the men. "You and I are called, like him, to be humble men who embrace humility. This world is a valley of tears and the only way it's going to change is if you and I preach the Gospel through our way of living."

Father James Farfaglia, pastor of Our Lady of Guadalupe Church in Corpus Christi, Texas, has a reputation for his no-nonsense approach to achieving greater holiness during an epidemic of mediocrity.

"I tell people if you just want to come in to church and sit in the pew and drool on Sundays and go home, I'm not the priest for you," Father Farfaglia said. "We need to be evangelical Catholics on fire for the Lord. Simply attending Sunday Mass is not going to cut it. If you are not convinced of the Gospel, you will not survive and the Church will not survive ... the

narrow road of the Gospel is difficult to live, but living the Gospel is the only road to salvation."

He said men should develop a spiritual life governed by the same kind of professional discipline they might use at their jobs.

"Be a man of prayer, take holiness seriously and make serious use of the sacrament of confession," he said. "Only by being disciples on fire for Christ will you truly be able to live in peace."

After Joseph Hyland's pro football career ended, the former coach at Eastern Michigan University became a Christian counselor. He runs Kolbe Counseling, which focuses on men and families dealing with sexual addictions.

Hyland said many men don't think they are strong enough or "too far gone to get help" from God. He used the example of the prodigal son as a reminder that nobody is ever out of reach of God's love and forgiveness.

"We're afraid of being great, afraid of our destiny, afraid of getting in touch with how God really made us," he said. "We've stepped off the lap of God our Father and like the prodigal son we're not listening to His voice anymore ... we need to go before God and beg for His grace."

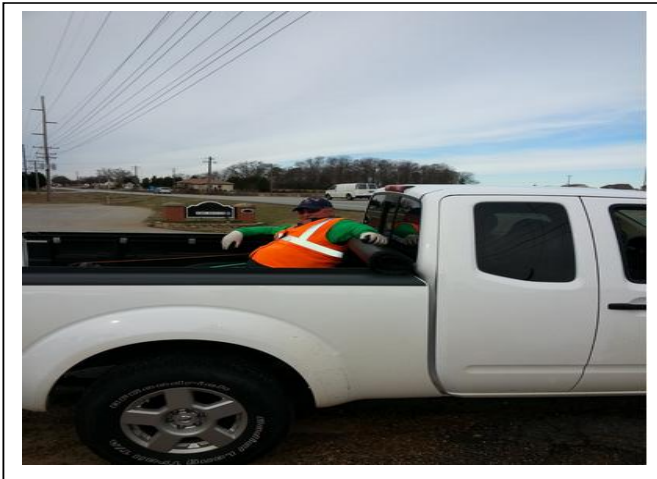

MILITARY ORDER OF THE PURPLE HEART SALUTES FT. HOOD VICTIMS

Springfield, VA April 6, 2015

On the occasion of their receipt of the Purple Heart Medal at a special awards ceremony at Ft. Hood, Texas on April 10, 2015, The Military Order of the Purple Heart proudly salutes the 32 military service members who were wounded, and the families of the 13 soldiers killed by Major Nidal Hassan on November 5, 2009.

This long awaited ceremony is made possible by a change in the law that expanded the eligibility criteria for the Purple Heart medal, which is awarded to those wounded or killed in combat. The shooting victims were previously deemed not eligible because it was initially determined that the shooting by Hassan was an act of workplace violence and not an "act of international terrorism," as defined in the criteria for the award.

Thanks for this overdue and solemn ceremony must go to the families of the victims, who for years have relentlessly pressed the Congress to reverse the U.S. Army decision which had denied the rightful recognition of the victims service and sacrifice. Their Members of Congress were successful in having legislation included in the 2015 National Defense Authorization Act that broadened the definition of an act of international terrorism to include acts by a perpetrator who may have had contact with a foreign terrorist organization, and "if the attack was inspired or motivated by the foreign terrorist organization." As a result, the new Purple Heart recipients will automatically qualify for combat-related special compensation upon retirement and be eligible for burial at Arlington National Cemetery. <http://www.purpleheart.org/>
