Vatican City, May 27, 2020 / 04:55 am MT (CNA).- Pope Francis approved a miracle attributed to the intercession of Fr. Michael J. McGivney Wednesday, paving the way for the beatification of the founder of the Knights of Columbus.

District Deputy Report

Our District Deputy John Friedline reported to the GA KOFC Officers at their recent Annual Meeting that St. Brendan Council 12942 has had another successful year in charitable works.

John stated *"they raised \$3,000 for Warriors to Lourdes and sent one Vet to Lourdes. For a new Father Michael J McGivney Stained Glass Window for the Church, they raised \$9,176. Another \$18,000 was raised for Whispering Hope Cumming Women's Center & PAC to support the fight against abortion with their Baby Bottle campaign."*

"The Council continued its support of the St. Joseph's Food Pantry and Forsyth County Jail Ministry. It also conducted 6 Boy Scouts merit badge seminars for 86 Scouts, raising \$1,000 to support the community at large. While volunteer hours were down overall due to COVID-19, the Council was able to support three Fish Fry's, a Polish Dinner, dinners for Priests, Teachers and the construction workers expanding St. Brendan's Church and Breakfast with Santa where over 1,500 meals were served."

"As of April 1, the original Membership quota had not been hit yet but the Council is not giving up and is looking for a successful June recruiting program."

During a May 26 meeting with Cardinal Angelo Becciu, the prefect of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints, the pope authorized the congregation to issue a decree recognizing the miracle.

McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus in 1882. Today it is the world's largest Catholic fraternal service organization, with nearly two million members in more than a dozen countries.

Born in Waterbury, Connecticut, in 1852, McGivney played a critical role in the growth of the Church in the United States in the latter part of the 19th century. After his ordination in Baltimore in 1877, he served a largely Irish-American and immigrant community in New Haven.

Amid an anti-Catholic climate, he established the Knights to provide spiritual aid to Catholic men and financial help for families that had lost their breadwinner.

A press release from the Knights of Columbus May 27 said the miracle recognized by Pope Francis involved an unborn child in the United States who was healed in utero of a life-threatening condition in 2015 after his family prayed to McGivney.

It added that a date would be set soon for the beatification Mass, which will take place in Connecticut.

Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson said: "Fr. McGivney has in-

spired generations of Catholic men to roll up their sleeves and put their faith into action. He was decades ahead of his time in giving the laity an important role within the Church."

"Today, his spirit continues to shape the extraordinary charitable work of Knights as they continue to serve those on the margins of society as he served widows and orphans in the 1880s."

"Fr. McGivney also remains an important role model for parish priests around the world and left us a transformative legacy of effective cooperation between the laity and clergy."

McGivney's sainthood cause officially opened in 1997 in the Archdiocese of Hartford, Connecticut. In 2008, Pope Benedict XVI declared the American-born priest a Venerable Servant of God in recognition of his life of heroic virtue.

In 2000, an investigation into a miracle attributed to McGivney's intercession was completed. But in 2011, the Vatican ruled that the event was not miraculous in nature.

In 2012, another possible miracle was reported and placed under investigation.

Following his beatification, McGivney's cause will require one more authenticated miracle before he can be considered for canonization.

He would not be the first member of the Knights of Columbus to be canonized. A group of six Mexican members of the organization were martyred during the Cristero War of 1926-29 and its aftermath.

The six are St. Luis Batis, St. Rodrigo Aguilar, St. Miguel de la Mora, St. Pedro de Jesús Maldonado, St. José María Robles, and St. Mateo Correa.

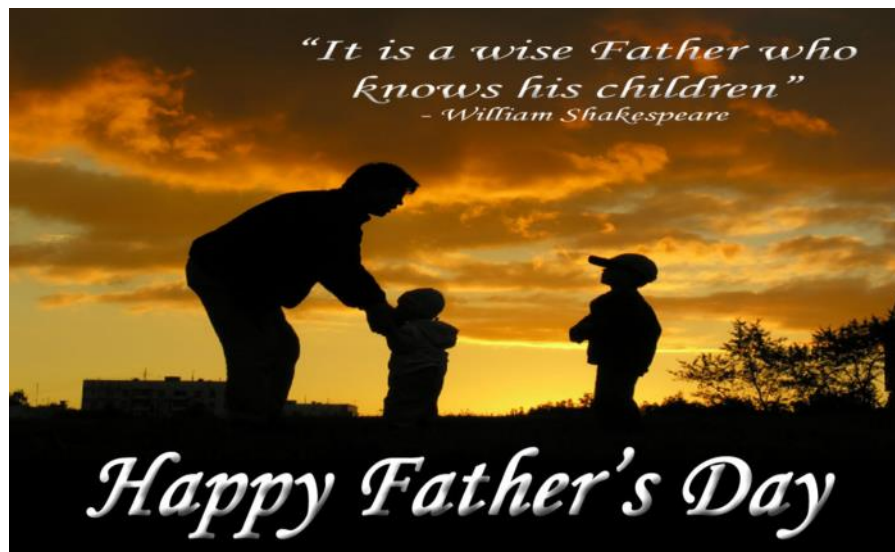

Baby Bottle Program Reaches Goal Thanks to Hard Work and Special Donors

It may be considered a miracle in our midst that the Baby Bottle Campaign reached its financial goal in the face of COVID-19 restrictions. But, it is true!

Past Grand Knight, Sir Curtis Weeks said "thanks to all our Council Knights for their ongoing support and presented the results of another successful year for our **Baby Bottle Program.**"

Initiated in 2009 to support KofC Right to Life the program additionally supports Whispering Hope/CWC with funds and ultrasound machines and saves an estimated of at least 70 abortions per year.



Although diverse, challenging situations: smaller mass sizes due to ongoing construction, competing programs, severe rainstorm on 1st week and virus concerns impacting 2nd week of collections in 2020, the bottle returns were 26% lower.

Despite a lower return bottle rate, \$18,000 was collected which **exceeded 2019 Program.**

This achievement was due to 6 top donors that represented 50% of the funds for this year's campaign.

Hope for Rebecca

Attanasio Family Remains Hopeful as Rebecca Stays the Treatment Course

Last year our Knight's Council responded in a big way to the Attanasio family's need for special cancer medical treatment for Rebecca, wife of Brother Anthony Attanasio. The fund-raising program was called "Hope for Rebecca."

Brother Anthony recently shared an update on Rebecca's medical condition.

"Everything is status quo with Rebecca, she is still on her holistic treatment protocol. Going the holistic way is like running a marathon, it takes a year to see if it is helping vs chemo which is like running a 40 yard dash and you see the effects immediately with serious consequences immediately.

The delay with tests is because of COVID-19, so our hope is she is able to see her surgeon soon who will recommend blood work follow up and maybe a petscan to see if the cancer has metastasized to another organ or bones.

All of this is out of pocket, so grateful for the money the Knights raised last year but quickly running out, it's almost a year since she started the treatment."

Let us continue to pray for Rebecca, Anthony and their family.

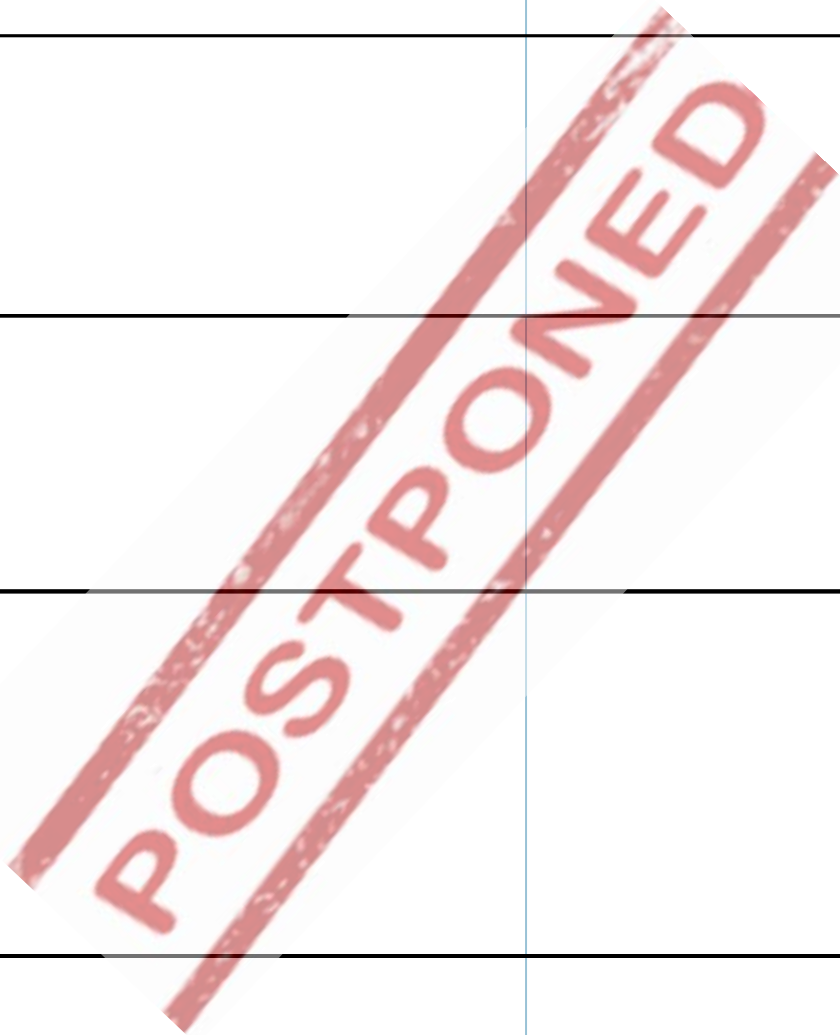

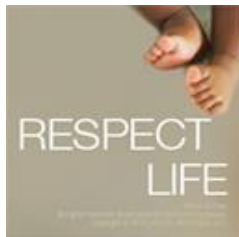
