

Family Project

Maybe you're not familiar with Father Patrick Peyton, known also as "the Rosary Priest." But he's the one who coined the phrase, "The family that prays together, stays together." He didn't just make up the phrase one day; he had been educated and formed on the immense value of the Rosary from birth. Father Peyton was so used to praying the family Rosary every night, for example, that when he left home for the first time to work and was staying with another Catholic family, he was shocked and distressed when they all went to bed without gathering to pray first. But he found the praying his own Rosary took away the pangs of homesickness, and stress. Later in his life, as he was preparing for priesthood, Father Peyton turned to Mary, and through his devotion to her, Father Peyton was miraculously healed from a debilitating disease.
