The Spiritual Corner

A customer brought an exquisite greeting card to the counter and reached for his wallet. Using the register scanner, the clerk said, "That will be three dollars, please." "Three dollars?" the customer bellowed. "Forget it!" He jammed the wallet back into his pocket and angrily left the store. When the clerk returned the card to the rack, she noticed that it read, "To my Wife, Because You Mean so Much To Me." You might say that the gentleman in the story was a bit of a hypocrite.

In the Gospel of Mark Jesus chastises the scribes for being hypocrites. But it goes much deeper than **DO AS I SAY NOT AS I DO**. The scribes were interpreters of Old Testament law. As such they were ancient day lawyers who like lawyers today were obliged to defend the law. Often they acted as trustees for estates and as payment received a share of the estate. The higher your status and the greater your reputation for piety, the more estates you could be in charge of. This is why some scribes dressed in fancy clothes and constantly prayed in public. It was good for business. Some of these unscrupulous scribes took more than their fair share of estates and drove the widows into poverty. They abused the very law that they were supposed to be defending for Mosaic Law requires that you not wrong any widow. Many scribes were given a gift by God

e.g. the power to protect the law, but they abused that gift. They abused what God gave them. I don't think that they started out as hypocrites. I'd be willing to bet you that many of them started out as deeply religious men who got caught up in the things of the world and lost site of God. Their perspective changed from God to prestige and money. Yet how often are you and I guilty of losing site of God. It is almost impossible not to. We live and work in a secular world where religion is rejected and ridiculed. God's name is never mentioned, prayer is unknown, the Bible is never read and conversation about spirituality is non existent. Success is measured by power and money. The media brings violence and pornography into our homes. There is an attitude that anything goes is business. Things have gotten so bad that many of the Catholic universities found it necessary to reintroduce ethics as part of their business curriculum. HOW CAN WE POSSIBLY FOCUS ON GOD? We can pray everyday. We can examine our conscience when we go to bed and become aware of our weaknesses. MOST IMPORTANTLY WE CAN REINFORCE OUR CATHOLIC BELIEFS BY COMING TOGETHER AS A COMMUNITY AS OFTEN AS POSSIBLE BY **PARTICPATING AT MASS.** To say that you never have time to get to Mass is only a reaffirmation that you are losing site of God and getting caught up in the things of the world. Let us not become hypocrites like the scribes by getting caught up in the things of the world. Let's keep our focus on God through prayer, examination of conscience, participation at Mass and by using our talents to do the little things that bring joy and peace to others.
