The Spiritual Corner

There is a story about a little boy named Timmy who came home from school very late. When his mother asked why he was so late Tim explained that he stopped to help a little girl whose wheel had come off her bike. His mother said" Why Timmy how could you help her when you couldn't put your wheel on your own bike?" Tim replied," I know I couldn't help her get the wheel back on but I could help her cry."

Tim in his innocence demonstrates compassion. There are many examples of compassion in the Bible. The prophet Isaiah tells us that the Lord will provide for all people. He will wipe the tears from all faces. In Matthew's gospel Jesus cures the sick and feeds the hungry out of compassion.

A number of years ago my wife and I spent a week in Appalachia working with the Passionist Volunteers. One of the first things they told us was not to judge the people we were supposed to help. When Jesus fed the crowds he did it without judging. He could have easily said" It's not my concern. They knew they would be following me for days. They should have made provisions to bring food and water. It's not my problem." But Jesus was more concerned with alleviating their hunger than judging them.

Advent is a period of preparation for the liturgical coming of Jesus, the second coming of Jesus and our personal meeting with Jesus at the end of our life. One of things that we can do to prepare for that coming is to see how compassionate we really are by examining our daily life. We could ask ourselves if we practiced the spiritual and corporal works of mercy? Did we do it without judging? Did we act in a non-compassionate way? Was I rude? Did I gossip? Did I seek to gain an advantage through intimidation? Did I take advantage of others less fortunate then myself? Finally, would I want Jesus to treat me as I treat others?
