The Spiritual Corner by Deacon John Kopcak PGK

The fourth Sunday of Easter and is also known as Good Shepherd Sunday. At first I planned to do a homily based on the idea of Jesus as the Good Shepherd and us as His Flock. But as I reread the Gospel one word kept on jumping out at me, HAND. There are all different kinds of hands. Big hands, small hands, rough hands, smooth hands, strong hands, weak hands, gentle hands. I once knew a woman whose husband was a hand model. He must have had handsome hands because they used his hands to make TV commercials. One thing that all hands have in common is that they can give peace, comfort and security when used to hold a child. Think of a time when you were 3 or 4 years old and in a large crowd. Think of how afraid and confused you got in the midst of all those people who were bigger than you. Those feelings seemed to disappear when your mother or father took your hand.

In John's Gospel, Jesus tells us that we are in His hand and no one can take us out. Being in the hands of Christ and the Father should be a source of great comfort and strength for us and if we choose to remain in His hands we will continue to have those feelings of safety and comfort. As Catholics and followers of Christ we are called TO BE HIS HANDS by giving consolation and comfort to one another especially the poor and the spiritually and physically sick. In fact we are called to be God's hands for anyone who is hurting. Let's face it. There are times in our lives when it seems that God no longer holds us in His hand, especially times of great tragedy. Where is His comfort then? I believe that it is there but our anger and frustration block God's healing presence. Why doesn't God take away our hurt? Why does God allow this to happen? Why doesn't he force His Healing presence on us? Why does He allow bad things to happen? When I was in kindergarten I lived about five blocks from school. I had to walk to school with my older sister who would walk me across the streets. I begged my mother to let me cross streets alone. Finally one day she said that she would watch me cross the street alone. If I did it carefully I could walk to school with my friends. I will never forget how alone I felt that day when I first crossed a street by myself. But you know I really wasn't alone. My mother was watching to keep me safe. She allowed me to feel alone because she understood that by crossing the street by myself I was growing, taking a small step toward adulthood. I think God does the same thing by not forcing His healing presence on us. He wants us to turn to Him and love Him by using the greatest gift He has given us, OUR FREE WILL. Only when we use this free will to turn to God in our time of need can we feel the presence of His hand in our lives. Only then can we GROW SPIRITUALLY.
