He will work directly with our members and will be


continuing the exceptional work that Stephen Znoj has provided in protecting our families.

Remembering Kevin Athaide by Bill Kelly

This is a remembrance of our ministry leader, Kevin Lius Athaide who died 6 years ago on June 13, ,2013.

Kevin Athaide taught us by the way he lived his life. Kevin was a wise teacher and a passionate seeker of Unity. Kevin was our leader in the work of uniting immigrants and volunteers to teach English and Life Skills.

In 2005, Kevin along with Sister Joan Daly, established the Our Family Program, a ministry of St. Brendan's Catholic Church. The ministry reaches out to immigrant women bringing them together with volunteers to learn English and life skills needed in the US.

In the ten years we were involved with the Our Family Program, hundreds of women studied English, some got their GED, others achieved US Citizenship; all because of the efforts of one man and his vision of including and uniting everyone.

Joanie Diaz Fagan was part of the leadership of the Our Family Program from the beginning. Joanie recalls a conversation in which Kevin spoke about his own experiences of being an immigrant:

"He remembered how Irish Catholic immigrants in the Bronx help him navigate "life in the United States" His mission was to give back and reciprocate his experience many years forward; without even knowing immigration issues. Kevin was a fearless leader that taught by example; without even knowing or acknowledging his amazing power. He did not know how his vision and his faith made and impact in his Parish, the community; and how his teachings made leaders like myself.

Grateful forever. He has been instrumental in my life because of his leadership. He did not even know his impact in others just leading by example."

Three days before Kevin died, Monday, June 10th, 2013, Kevin invited Joanie Diaz Fagan, Rose Kelly my wife and me to visit him in the bedroom of his home. He knew his time was short, but he insisted we come that Monday. We rushed over to see him.

Kevin laughed and the mood in the room lifted. We talked with him more about what he felt was important for us to remember and what he



might like us to do. In retrospect, we know, that it was with his last breaths that Kevin asked all of us to work hard for Unity.

On July 9th, 2013, Kevin's friends, teachers, students and supporters of the Our Family Program celebrated a memorial service at St. Brendan's Catholic Church for him.

Kevin's dream may have been for all of us to come together in communion and solidarity. At that Mass, thirteen of Kevin's friends, many recent immigrants, celebrated his life by each praying publicly in their own language from the ambo in the sanctuary for Unity, Justice and Peace. Voices and words in English, Spanish, French, Italian, K'iche, Polish, Igbo, German, Korean, Tagalog, Vietnamese, and an Indian language echoed in that church asking the Holy Spirit to bring us together.

Perhaps, one thing we can all do is to draw ourselves closer to that same warming Spirit then prayerfully remember that all hearts are one, including the one who made us?
