Georgia's Governor Signs 'Fetal Heartbeat' Abortion Law

Georgia Gov. Brian Kemp signed controversial legislation Tuesday that bans abortions in the state as soon as heartbeat activity is detectable, which typically occurs about six weeks into a pregnancy — before many women know they're pregnant.

At the signing ceremony, Kemp said he is grateful to those "throughout Georgia who refused to be silent on this issue, who rejected the status quo, who believe, as I do that every baby has a right to life."

"We must protect life at all stages. We must remember our higher calling," the Republican governor added.

Lawmakers approved the bill in March and the law is set to take effect Jan. 1, 2020. It significantly decreases the period of time for a woman to have an abortion in the state, currently set at 20 weeks.

The <u>Living Infants Fairness and Equality Act</u> allows for some exceptions, including in cases of rape or incest if a woman files a police report, or when the life of the pregnant woman is threatened. A woman can also have an abortion if her pregnancy is deemed "medically futile."

The final approval by Kemp is a fulfillment of campaign promises he made to supporters last year. It is also part of a larger national movement in which several conservative state legislatures are crafting bills to limit the procedure to the earliest stages of pregnancy.

Republican state Rep. Ginny Ehrhart, who co-sponsored the measure, <u>called</u> it "a historic day for Georgia families."

In an interview with *Fox & Friends,* she said the law "establishes personhood at the point that that human heartbeat is detected." Ehrhart said that allows "for 14th Amendment rights of protection to go into effect."

Backers of the law hope it triggers a U.S. Supreme Court battle over its constitutionality, ultimately overturning *Roe v. Wade*.

Meanwhile, abortion-rights supporters say they are planning to mount a legal challenge to Georgia's law before it goes into effect.

Andrea Young, executive director of the ACLU of Georgia, told NPR there has been "a tremendous outpouring of concern from all the different organizations working together to fight this legislation."

Young said the law essentially "functions as an abortion ban. And it limits the health exception for women, specifically it excludes mental health ... as a health concern that would provide a justifiable cause for an abortion." Republican governors in <u>Mississippi</u>, <u>Ohio</u> and <u>Kentucky</u> have recently signed similar laws. All three are being challenged

Georgia Governor Signs 'Fetal Heartbeat' Abortion Law

Gov. Brian Kemp of Georgia signed one of the <u>most restric-</u> <u>tive abortion laws</u> in the nation on Tuesday (May 7), effectively banning abortion after six weeks of pregnancy, when doctors can usually start detecting a fetal heartbeat.

Georgia is the fourth state to enact a so-called fetal heartbeat law this year. Like in other states, it is expected to face a swift legal challenge, which supporters hope will lead to a re-evaluation by the United States Supreme Court of the landmark 1973 ruling that made abortion legal nationwide.

Mr. Kemp, a Republican, said in a signing ceremony at the State Capitol that his administration is prepared for a court fight.

"Our job is to do what is right, not what is easy," he said. "We are called to be strong and courageous, and we will not back down."

Vivat Jesus!

Cristóbal Colón, as he was called by the monarchs of Spain who financed this journey, was a man of deep faith and dogged determination. He was a flawed man -- an explorer, an enslaver, a bungler and a fame seeker.

His discoveries led to an economic boon in the 15th and 16th centuries that continues today called the Columbian Exchange.

In his 2012 book, <u>1493 – Uncovering the New World Columbus Created</u>, Historian Charles Mann writes how the widespread transfer of plants, animals, culture and human populations increased wealth, nutrition and spawned capitalism.

Despite his faults, misconceptions and wrongheaded ideas – for example, he thought the world was shaped like a pear, Columbus believed that Christ was in the boat with him and his actions in the long term changed the world for the better.

If you *Google* Christopher Columbus, you get three quotes. Here are two of them:

No one should fear to undertake any task in the name of our Saviour, if it is just and if the intention is purely for His holy service.

For the execution of the voyage to the Indies, I did not make use of intelligence, mathematics or maps.

Columbus embraced uncertainty and acted in Faith.

Archbishop Wilton Gregory, the new archbishop of Washington DC, has set sail on a new voyage in very choppy waters.

In his installation homily, Bishop Gregory promised to be transparent - "to honestly confess my faults and failings before you when I commit them not when they are revealed. He also admitted, "We clerics and hierarchs have irrefutably been the source of the current tempest." He promised to carry the Gospel message to the poor, the marginalized and the neglected.

Bishop Gregory recalled the image of Christ asleep in the boat when the sea grew violent and angry. His apostles were frightened and uncertain as some good priests and laity are now. They woke Jesus and said we are about to sink and drown!

Jesus chastised them with the words like, "Have you no faith?" They forgot that Jesus was there in the boat with them. Like us and Columbus, the apostles were imperfect men, but they acted on their faith in Jesus.

Later, through their trust in Jesus, the apostles would change the world in ways greater than Columbus could have ever dreamed possible.

As Knights, when we act to do the things of our charter to promote and conduct educational, charitable, religious and social welfare works; to render mutual aid and assistance to sick and needy members and our families and when we reach out to the poor, marginalized and neglected, we act in good faith.

My brothers remember that Jesus is in the boat with us, too. As imperfect men, we may bungle, trip and doubt, but we are in good company and we are also changing the world in small and big ways.

Vivat Jesus!
