We welcome you and encourage you to take the Fourth-Degree!

Want to welcome our NEW Financial Secretary **Gregory Santini** who comes highly recommended by Brother Knights **Bill Kelly, Bill Hickman** and **Matt Brech** to name just a few!

Just wanted to take a few minutes to update all of you regarding the current financial state of our Council: (Information prepared by Treasurer **Steve Herzog** & Chancellor **Tony Terbrueggen**)

Second Notice was sent to 172 non-paying Knights last week. You have 30 days to make your payment or you will receive a third notification that your Membership has been suspended.

- For all our Brother Knights & the 172 of you that don't know this but your \$42 Membership Dues that hasn't been paid (\$7,224 not available to do charity works for our Parish & Community) our Council is required to send \$8.50 to the Supreme Council in New Haven CT and \$14.00 to the Georgia State KOFC for a total of \$22.50 or \$3,870 our Council has payout regardless if you have paid your Membership dues or not.
- For the last number of years, we haven't spent a considerable amount of time following up on dues collections. Please help us so we can spend more time working on Faith in Action Programs and serving the needs of our Parish family and community.
- We have transitioned to a credit card renewal program for all Knights, for both our current and next Calendar year Membership dues.

- For anyone wanting to lessen the number of hours your fellow Brothers Knights have to work on Worthy Projects, you have the option to pay by check but will be required to fill out an on-line tracking report. If not completed on time there will be a late fee assessed. We need to get the Membership Dues Collection process fixed.

I have a few comments I would like to make regarding our last Council meeting on September 9th. I want to let you know, that where necessary, I have spoken to the individual (s) involved. Here are some of the things we need to improve:

- When the gavel goes down everyone must stop talking immediately to bring the Council meeting to order.
- Any and all side conversations must end during the meeting. Respect your other Knights who are trying to input information to help our Council. It's interesting that I had at least 10 Brother Knights tell me about conversations during our Council meeting that included gossip, politics and quite frankly rude conversations and treatment to some of our speakers. If this happens again, I will ask the Inside and Outside Guards to immediately escort you out!

- At our next Council meeting one of our Catholic Christian Brother Knights will address the proper protocol on how to address the Grand Knight and others at a Council meeting. I heard from 3 different Knights, regarding one Knight, demanding to be heard but never stood up. My bad, it won't happen again.
- Any and all presentations that will be made at our Council meetings from this point on will be submitted to me for approval one week in advance.
- Three Unspoken Elephants in Our Knights Room:
 - I was told by the a few Knights that Father Matthew, because he does not attend our second Monday of the month Council Meetings does not care for the Knights versus other Pastors i.e. St. Benedict & St. Brigid. Well by now you all know how shy I am and asked Father Matthew directly. Most Reverend Father Matthew explained (as he did to numerous other Knights before but no one ever spoke about it other than to say why isn't he here as our Chaplin) that Monday is his day off and the evening is his time with all the other Priests to celebrate dinner together just as most of us like to with our families. Father then asked if we could change our Council meeting to another date he said he could attend and I laughed and told him that we only have done that one time to hear Father John Bartunek speak and I said it would take a miracle to get that accomplished but my preference would be the second Thursday of the month but this is up to the Council to decide. The message is that Father Matthew cared so much for the Parishioners that he gave us permission to run a very successful Hope for Rebecca campaign while he has been working tirelessly to Build A Bigger Boat Campaign and picking weeds and whacking the grass again showing us by his example, not just words.
 - Father Matthew addressed the Knights at our last Summer Social encouraging our St. Brendan's Knights to Volunteer with the Welcoming and Beautification Program.

The exemplification of the Knighthood (Third) Degree will be conducted on Saturday, October 12, 2019 at St. Thomas Aquinas, 535 Rucker Road, Alpharetta at 10:00 AM.

Candidates should be present <u>at least</u> 30 minutes before the Knighthood Degree for registration and observers should arrive no later than 15 minutes before the start of the degree. The proper attire is coat and tie for candidates and observers. Each council is to provide Third Degree Membership Cards for each of their candidates. It is recommended that each council send at least one observer to accompany each candidate.

The degree should last about two hours including the meal immediately following the degree.
