A number of my dear friends with the Knights have and are experiencing friends or family with Alzheimer's. I share this article with all of you and the way our family attempted to deal with this terrible disease and the caregiving. My Father was providing my Mom's caregiving and despite his excellent health as a runner and marathon runner most of his life, he developed leukemia. My older brother Tim (oldest of 8) quit his Advertising job in Chicago and took on with his wife Mary and children to care for my folks. My sister Alice and I would help but being in Mexico City and Atlanta we could not offer the full time care my Mom needed. My Mom died in a Catholic Home a year and a half later. My Dads prayer to God was simple: "God please let me be with Grace (my Mom) at the end". My Dads prayer was answered and he died 6 months later.



You are now able to donate/give to the Baby Bottle Program directly from your cell phone/ smartphone.

Follow the instructions on this page to do a onetime setup of your account for this donation and future use.

After the setup you will be able to text the amount of your gift.

How to Use Text Giving

If you have already been using online giving (offertory, Faith Formation registration etc.) using Parishsoft and have set up an account (using the sign in feature) go to Step 6. If not, start with Step 1 below:

Text the word **GIVE** to 770-766-8443.

- You will be prompted to click a link directing you to the online giving page to complete a one time registration. Click "SIGN IN" then click "REGISTER FOR AN ACCOUNT" at the bottom of the page
- Enter the secure PIN that the system texts you.
- Select the fund, enter the donation amount and payment information before completing your gift
- Click "SAVE PAYMENT" to keep your payment information securely saved for future gifts.
- To text a donation after the one time registration, you can give immediately without having to re-enter any of your information
- Simply text the desired amount and the fund keyword to the text giving number (770-766-8443). Ex 10 baby for \$10 to the Knights Baby Bottle fund.

Other Text Commands

After your one time registration you will be able to use the following keywords

EDIT- Make changes to your giving account and update contact information and/or payment information

REFUND- Refund your last gift. You must text REFUND within 15 minutes to refund the gift. If you realized the mistake after 15 minutes, contact <u>jvanvel</u>-sorstbrendansat1.com for assistance with the refund.

KEYWORD- See a list of active keywords. Keywords are the fund names the church has set up.

The development of the GSGA Adaptive Golf program has made Georgia one of the leaders in the movement to make the game more accessible to individuals with mobility or cognitive challenges. The goal is to make playing golf a reality for the 20 million disabled men and women who would like to play the game.

The GSGA program, led by PGA professional David Windsor, began in 2015 and is open to all ages. It provides specialized equipment that allows golfers to control their swing. The goal is to enhance the life of the participants through golf.

Windsor is one of the pioneers in the adaptive golf movement. In 1999, he started conducting adaptive golf clinics when he was a professional in Florida and continues to work tirelessly to meet his goals to expand the borders of the game. In 2015 he received the Patriot Award from the PGA of America, a national honor given for his work with veterans with disabilities.

Windsor said, "It is so gratifying. That's the driving force. At the end of the day, you know we've made a difference and people are appreciative of it. They come up and tell you how it saved their life. We've had folks that have been through it all."

One of the largest growing areas for inclusion is veterans who are suffering from the effects of PTSD and those who are trying to recover from the effects of a stroke.

"Every 40 seconds someone in the United States has a stroke," Windsor said. "So it's just a great way to get them back out there. A lot of it is building back the confidence and being around others who are dealing with the same issues. That really helps give them a boost."

The GSGA became the first allied golf association in the country to conduct an Adaptive Golf Championship, which was hosted at Bobby Jones Golf Course in Atlanta in October 2019. The competition drew players from 16 states, as far away as California, Arizona and Michigan.

Tracy Ramin of Minnesota won the first event. "This was a really good event. It felt professionally-ran — between the scoreboard, the caddie bibs — they really took care of us," Ramin said. "It definitely felt that we were important and this was a serious championship. I loved seeing how well it was portrayed by the GSGA. Id love to come back and defend my title. Very proud to be the winner of the inaugural GSGA Adaptive Golf Championship."

There are ongoing opportunities for adaptive golf throughout the state in Atlanta, Savannah, Augusta and Valdosta. Seventeen different facilities serve as sites for adaptive clinics and instruction, with more sought by the program's organizers. There are more than 70 trained coaches and volunteers in Georgia, with a need for more.

Fr. Michael J. McGivney Stained Glass Window Knights of Columbus Council 12942 FUND RAISER



Who is the Venerable Father Michael J. McGivney?

On an icy Monday morning on February 6, 1882, the New Haven, Connecticut Probate Court heard the case of 19-year-old Alfred Downes, one of 14 children whose father Edward had died suddenly.

Under Connecticut law, the Probate Court had the right to assign children to public institutions if the family had no way to provide for them. To avoid the separation of Alfred from his widowed mother, brothers and sisters, someone would have to post a \$1,500 bond to ensure the court that the fatherless child would not be neglected.

The judge asked if anyone was present in the courtroom who could enter into a guardianship for Alfred Downes.

A man wearing a black cassock stood up. He was a Catholic Priest, and the sight of a Priest in a public, government facility was very unusual for that time. But this was no ordinary Priest. He was **Father Michael J. McGivney**, the assistant pastor at St. Mary's Catholic Church, and he had come to the courthouse because a Catholic family was in trouble.

This priest's obsession to do something about the hardships suffered by Catholic families would define his short life and eventually lead the Catholic Church to consider him for sainthood.

Father McGivney is the founder of the Knights of Columbus, the world's largest Catholic men's fraternal organization.




