"A Man and A Sacrament"

It's nighttime on March 29, 2018, Holy Thursday. There's still time to tell a story about oil, hope, curing vs healing and a happy death.

My brother Jack Kelly died on March 9th. He suffered for three years. The past 16 months were the hardest. I stayed with him the last seven days of his life.

Jack was a tough no BS kind of guy who had little tolerance for drama. He was not what I would call an effusive Christian.

What he told me days before he died surprised me, in a way.

It had to do with his receiving the Anointing of the Sick, a sacrament of the Catholic Church given to those in danger.

In November 2016, in crisis, Jack entered the hospital. Doctors said if he didn't get medical care then he would likely have been dead in two or three days. They stabilized him and discharged him to Hospice care with about two months to live.

Could I ask a priest to go to the hospital to anoint him? Jack was reluctant and skeptical but agreed.

I called Fr. Chris at Nativity of Our Lord parish. I warned Fr. Chris that Jack was a rough guy and that he may just throw him out. We laughed. He said don't worry I think I can handle it.

Fr. Chris walked into Jack's hospital room where my Brother Mike was waiting with Jack for the discharge orders and said rather loudly, "Where's Luke." Stunned, my brothers looked up and Fr. Chris repeated, "Where's Luke?"

Gathering his presence, my brother Jack looked at him a bit sternly and said, "I'm John F. Kelly!"

"Ah," Fr. Chris retorted, "You're the guy I'm looking for." He told them who he was and why he was there. They all laughed, and Fr. Chris explained why the sacrament is a good thing.

The anointing of the sick conveys several graces and imparts gifts of strengthening in the Holy Spirit against anxiety, discouragement, and temptation, and conveys peace and fortitude (CCC 1520). These graces flow from the atoning death of Jesus Christ, for "this was to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet Isaiah, 'He took our infirmities and bore our diseases'" (Matt. 8:17). And, if the person has committed any sins, they are immediately forgiven.

Today on Holy Thursday, in the Roman Catholic tradition, the Bishop celebrates a special mass in union with all the priests in the diocese called the Chrism Mass. Here the bishop blesses three oils. The oil is consecrated and used in the administration of sacraments throughout the year. The oil of Catechumens is used in Baptisms; the oil of the infirm to anoint the sick, and sacred Chrism used in the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Orders.

Fr. Chris used the oil of the infirm to anoint Jack 16 months ago.

"Is any among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up; and if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven" (Jas. 5:14–15).

Anointing with Holy Oils is a sign of the Holy Spirit. In the first scripture reading at Catholic Mass today IS 61:1-3a,6a,8b-9, the 8th century BC Jewish prophet, Isaiah is quoted as saying:

The Spirit of the Lord God is upon me,

Because the LORD has anointed me:

He has sent me to bring glad tidings to the lowly,

To heal the brokenhearted,

To proclaim liberty to the captives and release to the prisoners,

To announce a year of favor from the LORD

And a day of vindication by our God,

To comfort all who mourn; to place on those who mourn in Zion

A diadem instead of ashes,

To give the oil of gladness in place of mourning,

A glorious mantle instead of a listless spirit.

A few days before he died, Jack said to me, "Bill, this has been the best year of my life."

"What!" I said. How could that be with all the suffering you have gone through?"

And Jack said, "The Holy Spirit has shown me how to put the story of my life together. I understand it like I have never been able to before. I am in a good place with my heavenly father, Bill. Whatever He has in store for me, I'm okay with it."

Jack died in peace the day the azaleas bloomed outside his window.

Is Charitable Giving of Life Insurance Right for You?

Frequently asked questions

There are a lot of good reasons to consider using a life insurance policy for the purpose of giving to your local charity. Among these is the fact that it ultimately provides to the charity a much larger gift than would be possible with other assets: like cash, stocks, bonds or even real estate. In addition to the multiplication of the bequests to the charity the method for completing the transaction is relatively simple, confidential, and extremely effective. We've compiled a list of some of the questions others have had, and you might have, regarding this most effective giving method.

Q: WHY SHOULD I CONSIDER A CHARITABLE GIFT OF LIFE INSURANCE?

A: Basically, the gift of life insurance to a charitable organization permits a person the opportunity to give a maximum bequest (life insurance death benefit) for a relatively small amount of charitable contribution (the policy premiums). This can accomplish the charitable goals of the donor in an efficient, timely manner, upon the death of the insured person outside the probate process, and therefore not a matter of public record.

Q: ARE THERE ANY OTHER ADVANTAGES?

A: Yes, generally, as long as the new life insurance policy is owned by the charity, the premiums for the policy are deductible from federal income taxes as charitable gifts (subject to limits of income). Since the charity is designated as the beneficiary, you'll have the benefit of knowing that upon the insured's death, the life insurance death benefit will be paid directly to the charity you have chosen.

Q: IS A GIFT OF LIFE INSURANCE TO A CHARITY SOMETHING THAT EVERYONE SHOULD CONSIDER?

A: No. Only people whose individual life insurance needs have already been met (for things such as income replacement, mortgage protection, education funding, cash needs, final expenses, estate and retirement planning and business succession, for example), should consider gifting a life insurance policy to a charity. The first thing to consider must always be the protection of your family's interests.

Q: HOW DO I DETERMINE IF GIVING A LIFE INSURANCE POLICY TO CHARITY IS RIGHT FOR ME?

A: Again, only after serious and thoughtful consideration of your family's needs should this be contemplated. In consultation with your family, a trusted financial advisor and your accountant and/or lawyer you may determine if this is a suitable option for you. Your Knights of Columbus insurance agent has the knowledge and analytical tools to help you determine if your other needs are covered. This consultation is free. He can also provide the products you may need to accomplish your goals.
