State Deputy's Message

My Brother Knights

The snow is swirling as I prepare this letter and it seems that spring is far off.

The reality, however, is that spring will soon be here and there are less than five months remaining for us to achieve our membership gain goals that we set last July 1st.

Keeping with the membership slogan from Supreme Council, One Member per Council per Month, we continue to stress, that membership growth campaigns need to occur **365** days a year, not just during the fall and spring membership drives.

Remember our motto "One Member per Council per Month" and "One First Degree per Council or District per Month." If you are successful achieving those goals your will have the additional manpower to help achieve those wonderful programs in support of our Church and our community.

Supreme Knight addressed a recent gathering of state deputies continuing his theme 'We will all be Brothers, Our Vocation to Fraternity.'

"The vast majority of men who are Knights of Columbus members were asked to join by a family member or a friend," the supreme knight said. "And the vast majority said that they never or rarely ask someone to join the Knights of Columbus. That has to change, and that message has to come from you and me repeatedly. Ask a friend to join. Ask a fellow catholic to join, that's our responsibility for membership growth."

He added that the Order has the building blocks in place for steady consistent growth: the one new member, per council per month recruitment plan; the focus to increase the number of Star Council award winners; and the urgency to increase the number of First Degree exemplifications.

Retirement Planning in Three Buckets:

Taxable – Tax deferred – Tax free -- Where is your money?



I cannot tell you how many times I listen to a talking head on one of the news networks tell me that taxes are going to be lower when I retire......I know I am a simple man, but even I know that there is no way the government can afford to lower taxes and pay off \$14,700,000,000,000.00, (\$14 Trillion, 700 Billion), of debt without either slashing spending to the bone or raising taxes.

The popular talking heads all say things like the government will probably raise the capital gains tax, etc. Well, here's a look at the 2012 statistics that should be an eye opener for most of us.

In 2012, Americans reported on their tax forms \$6.3 Trillion of taxable wages. And the following:

\$333 Billion in capital gains

\$320 Billion in dividends from Stocks

\$300 Billion in cash disbursements from owned businesses

Or about a Trillion or so. So, if the government needs to close a budget gap to pay off debt service, where can they get their biggest helping of cash????? Doubling the capital gains tax would only increase revenue by \$30 billion, that is about 2 tenths of one percent of the debt. If the government raised taxes across the board 10% it would raise \$630 billion or about 4.2% of the total debt.....

So in the next ten years or so, when there will be 1.5 working Americans for every person on Social Security, (60 years ago there were 42 workers for each person receiving benefits).....and when the costs of Medicare exceed the taxes brought in and the cost of Medicaid is expected to go up 50%, where is the government going to go find the revenue? Capital gains? Tax the top 1%? It is time for us to wake up and smell the coffee. Taxes are not going down when you retire.

People yearn for the good old days, but in the 50's the top tax bracket was over 70% and the lowest was twice what it is today. Ladies and gentlemen I am here today to tell you, that for taxes, we are in the midst of the good old days, because we are in an extended period of the lowest income taxes that have ever been on the books in the history of taxes in the United States.....and our government spending is higher than ever. All of us who have a budget to stick to in our homes, know you cannot continue to spend more than you make or else trouble is brewing.

Why is this our insurance report for the month of March? As I write this, there are only 462 members of this Group out of over 63,000 Knights in New Jersey. If you are on Facebook, and haven't joined the Group, please do today!

If you have, please fill out the reporting form in the Grand Knight's Handbook and get into the running for the 2015 Huggie Award! Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception Program

IMMACULATE CONCEPTION Marian Program Image

You are all beautiful, Mary, and there is in you no stain of original sin. Image Blessed by Pope Francis

The Knights of Columbus Immaculate Conception Marian Prayer Program honors the central place the Blessed Virgin Mary holds in the life of our Order, and historic devotion that has been afforded to the Immaculate Conception by the Church in North America. The first cathedral in the New World, north of Mexico, was named for the Immaculate Conception, and the bishops of the United States named Mary, under her title of the Immaculate Conception, as the patroness of the nation.

In 1647 the Jesuit missionaries traveled throughout the new North American territories as evangelists spreading the word of God. They faced many challenges and numerous obstacles in the evangelization process. They were 'not afraid' to spread the word of God.


In 1664, Bishop Francois de Laval designated the current cathedral as the first parish church of Quebec and named it Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception. At this period of time, possessions of France, from the Atlantic Coast in Canada, to the Diocese of Quebec, encompassed all the North America, the plains of the far West, plus the Mississippi valley and Louisiana territories – an area far larger than all of Europe. The cathedral celebrated its 350 anniversary last year.

Sister Marie of the Eucharist, a young artistically talented Sister of Charity of Quebec in 1925 painted this picture to replace an 18th-century painting destroyed during a fire at the cathedral. Our traveling image is about a half-scale exact reproduction of the painting by Sister Marie that hangs behind the main altar of the Basilica-Cathedral of Notre-Dame de Quebec (Google this site for more info). The image is set under a large golden dome structure above the altar.

Today we, the Knights of Columbus, together with Our Blessed Mother and Her Rosary, must continue the evangelization process. Embrace Her and go out and spread the good word to all. Pope Francis asks this of us, our order implores us, and the church needs us. - If not us who will do it?

Our Mother will help us. As St John Paul said, "Do not be afraid". Our Order says "If it is to be, it is up to us".
