

April brings us into Spring and a month closer to the State Convention in Wildwood. You should be getting ready for the final sprint in the home stretch to win the race for a Culture of Life!

Disabilities Drive. April brings us a brand new opportunity to reach our fundraising goal for those with physical and intellectual disabilities. We keep reaching for the stars (\$1 million) and falling way short. At this point, I would be happy if we raised \$750,000 this go around. Your council should be all ready to go with a big push this month to kick things off with programs that:

- Solicit donations from local merchants
- Hold a social event to benefit the drive
- Run a 50/50 specifically for this program
- Send personal letters to council members requesting donations

Be creative in coming up with ways to raise as much money as you can. Details are on page 10-39 of the Grand Knights Manual.

State Diaper Drive. As part of Mother's Day month, we will again be holding a Diaper Drive at the state convention in Wildwood. Be sure to throw a box of diapers in the trunk before you head down for the weekend, and drop it off at the Pro-Life table at the convention center. We would like to see a mountain of diapers, wipes, and formula by the close of the business session on Saturday. Donations will be divided among the five dioceses, so please be generous! You should also be planning a diaper drop at your council for the month of May. Encourage members to bring diapers and wipes to your meeting to drop off for delivery to a pregnancy care center in your area.

White Ribbon against Pornography. We will also be selling White Ribbon car magnets at the convention again this year. You can order them in advance by sending a check for \$5 each, made out to the NJ State Council, to Morality in the Media chairman Dan Foley at 4 Haddington Lane, Manchester NJ 08759. Please indicate the council name and number, and the quantity of magnets being ordered. They can then be picked up at the state convention.

Exercise Your Catholic Voice in the Media. Things will continue to get worse in this country if we continue to sit by and say nothing. That is why our "Letter Writing Committee" is so important. Third place winner Carly Rodriguez, St. Ann School, Raritan


Fourth place winner Aparna Natarajan, St. Helena School, Edison.

Happy Easter Brothers. With the Rite of Christian Initiation as Adults (RCIA) program completed on Easter, you now have a few more members in your parish. It is encouraged that you ask these new men to get to know some of their fellow parishioners by joining the Knights of Columbus and by getting involved in some council and parish activities.

Now that the March church drives are over, it is time to follow-up with your prospect list and invite the prospects and their wives to an open house and to have them make their first degree. Be sure to send them a letter announcing the first degree and the details needed for them to experience a nice exemplification. Your letter of invitation should include the sign-in time, the amount of money needed for the one-time initiation fee and prorated dues. Also mention that a jacket and tie is preferred for degrees. Include the contact information of the council membership director or whoever is collecting the names of the candidates for the degree.

Not everyone on your prospect list will be able to make the degree scheduled sponsored by your so it is a good idea to list 2 or 3 other dates of degrees in your area as well as to offer the chance to take the degree by DVD. Hopefully, giving alternates dates and methods will enable your prospects to join your council in a timely manner.
