Community and in our parish.  
The Knight of Columbus meeting was closed. And the Columbian Club was opened. Bob Betik, president called the Columbian Club to order. A question was raised at the October 12<sup>th</sup> 2017 meeting, after the Knights of Columbus Columbian Club Board of Directors recommended a 28' x 30' small smoker type building with no plumbing. This prompted followup on whether or not the Columbian club was functioning as a food service provider (restaurant) and would have to be approved by the US Department of Agriculture with plumbing for pre and post cleanup with appropriate followup on compliance. The USDA indicated "as long as we are not butchering animals," the proposed building concept was acceptable. (10/2017)

Bob Betik proceeded to determine what the council wanted to do with the building project and submitted two (2) option vote for the council members to choose. (see attached)
