ORIGINAL EXCERPTS FROM THE OCT 12TH MEETING
PERTAINING THE K OF C HALL

Building Art briefed the Council on building repair and maintenance. A ~~New Business~~ motion was introduced to close the general mtg. and open the Columbian Club for business. - motion was seconded and approved.

The Grand Knight introduced Bob Betig Columbian Club President.

Bob proceeded to inform the Council that the City Health Department has issued a requirement that we have a building to house our BBQ pits so that we can continue to cook for our charity events. The building is also a requirement so that we can keep our kitchen permitted by the City as an approved kitchen. The Knight's Columbian Club Board presented their recommendations to determine the feasibility of this building project. Three options were identified:

- ① No cooking - outside of hall.
- ② Build a smoker type building compliant with City Ordinances.
- ③ Find another site for cooking BBQ.

Bob introduced Art Wernersbach, Kofc project

Coordinator - who indicated that a 28'x30' small ^{smoker type} building with no plumbing adjacent to our current building is the ^{the} recommendation of the Knight's Columbian Club Board of Directors.

CONTINUED...

The cost of new building will be approximately \$75,000. to be financed over a 10 year period of time at 5% ^{or \$19500/-per month.} We will continue with this project. The next step we be to go before the Planning and Zoning Dept. and then the City Council. - Bob and Art then opened up the floor for questions.

"No plumbing"

1st Question - "If the KofC Columbian Club is interpreted as a food service/preparation provider (restaurant) we will have to be approved by US Department of Agriculture with plumbing for pre+post cleanup? (water) Columbian Club meeting was concluded with necessary followup on compliances (TBD) motion to open KofC was seconded and approved.
