FACTS ABOUT LIFE INSURANCE

September is Life Insurance Awareness Month. To help educate consumers about the need for and value of adequate life insurance protection, the Life Insurance Market Research Association (LIMRA) has published the following five facts. These statistics are certainly worth considering.

- Fact 1: Nearly 75 percent of North Americans agree that life insurance is the best way to protect against premature death of the primary wage earner.
- Fact 2: Twenty-four million households have no life insurance protection at all. Almost one third of adults have no life insurance protection.
- Fact 3: Forty-four percent of all households either don't own life insurance and believe they should, or own life insurance and believe they need more. Among those that already own some life insurance, 40 percent believe they don't have enough.
- ➤ Fact 4: One-fourth of primary wage earners feel they do not have a plan in place to provide a decent standard of living for their family if they died tomorrow. Twelve percent of families would immediately have trouble meeting everyday living expenses and another 15 percent would have difficulty keeping up after several months.
- Fact 5: People would like to discuss life insurance with a qualified professional agent. They believe that buying life insurance is an important and complex financial decision. Half find it difficult to decide how much to buy, and 43 percent worry about making the wrong decision.


I will also be asking for help the **weekend of September 26 and 27th at St. Peter's Masses**.

Overview of St. Patrick's Respect Life Ministry

Contact - Monica Ludwig, Director of Social Concerns 301-924-2285, stpatsoccon@verizon.net. The Respect Life Ministry supports a variety of fundraisers, drives, educational efforts and advocacy of life issues throughout the year.

Annual fundraisers include the Mother's Day Carnation Sale (MAY), the Baby Bottle Campaign & Baby Items Drive (OCT) and the Christmas Card Sale (NOV). Proceeds from the sale of flowers and cards go to Right to Life of Montgomery County which supports local efforts to protect life in this county. Beneficiaries of the baby bottle collection alternate between the Gabriel Project (Montgomery County Catholic Cluster) and Shady Grove Pregnancy Center. Baby Items Drive donations are split among Gabriel Project and Partners in Faith (PIF).

Supporting educational / prayer efforts includes participation in the USCCB Rosary for Life (JAN) and the annual March for Life in DC (JAN 22). A bus is sponsored to enable parishioners to attend the March. For the past 4 years, St. Patrick's has joined other area churches/parishes to participate in 40 Day for Life Campaigns in Germantown, MD (MAR & OCT). These nationwide Campaigns are peaceful times of prayer and witness for life at a local abortion facility. Find more information at PrayforGermantown.com.

Parishioners are encouraged to sign up with the Maryland Catholic Conference of Bishops to receive updates on legislation in the MD Assembly and to attend Catholic Lobby Night (3rd Monday in FEB). 
