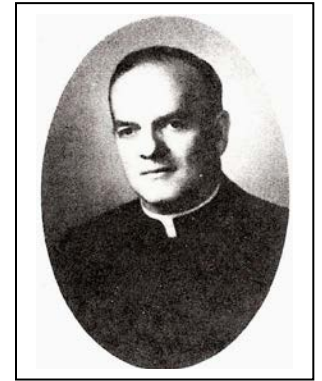

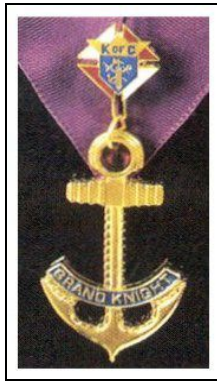


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GRAND KNIGHT'S MESSAGE

Motto: "Lord, help me to say 'Yes' to Your will."

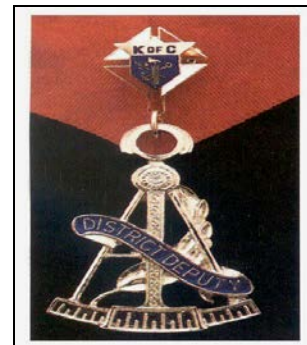

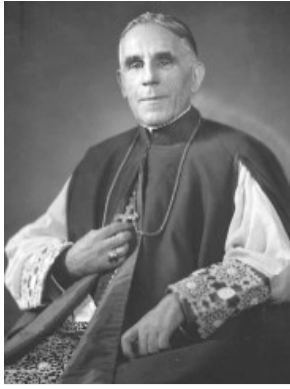

Centro Tepeyac Moves

Centro Tepeyac has begun its 25th year as a pregnancy support center in Silver Spring. It recently moved to a larger, more convenient location at the McCarrick Center (12247 Georgia Avenue), where it is now collocated with Catholic Charities and the pregnancy center Birthright. The day it opened in March, two babies were saved, bringing the total to over 700 saves since it began operation in 1990. More than 20,000 people have benefited from its services. Centro Tepeyac has partnered with Save the Storks to purchase one of its mobile vans equipped to offer free ultrasounds. With license plates recently issued by Maryland, the van is set to help women as they go to abortion clinics. May God bless the work of this center – and that of all pregnancy support centers.

House Passes Abortion Bill

After months of delays, the House passed the Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act (H.R. 36) on May 13. The Act would prohibit abortions after 20 weeks of pregnancy — except in cases of rape, incest or threat to the mother's life. The bill, which passed 242-184 along mostly party lines, was pulled in late January after a protest over a requirement that a rape be reported to law enforcement officials for women to be exempt from the 20-week limit. That provision was removed and the bill now requires rape victims to receive counseling and face a 48-hour waiting period before getting an abortion after 20 weeks. It is estimated that annually about 10,000 abortions take place after 20 weeks. The bill faces an unclear future in the Senate and almost certainly will be vetoed by President Barack Obama.

Our Tax Dollars at Work

Planned Parenthood, according to its 2014 report, terminated 516,000 unintended pregnancies and provided 1,440,000 emergency contraception kits (many no doubt providing morning-after abortifacients). This gigantic corporation, with \$1.7 billion in assets, received \$528,000 in federal funding in its 2014 fiscal year. That is more than one-half billion dollars of our tax-contributed money given by our government. And now that same government, through the IRS, is allowing women to deduct the expense of having an abortion from their income taxes. Is this a government of, by and for the people?

RUNNING OF THE ROSE THE 2015 SILVER ROSE PROGRAM



Beginning in April 2015, six Silver Roses began their journey across North America, from Canada to the United States to Mexico. The 2015 Our Lady of Guadalupe Silver Rose - One Life, One Rose Program will conclude on December 12, 2015 on

the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas, at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey, Mexico.

2015 marks the 55th year of the program which began in 1960 as a project of the Columbian Squires of North America to honor the Blessed Virgin under her title of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas. The program has continued since then as a project of Columbian Squires circles, councils and Fourth Degree assemblies in several jurisdictions.

In 2001 Supreme Knight Carl Anderson expanded the program by beginning the "Running of the Rose" from the 119th Annual Meeting of the Supreme Council in Toronto. This is "a perfect program for the Knights of Columbus," said Supreme Knight Anderson. "Through it we honor not only Our Lady of Guadalupe and express the unity of the Order, but we also reaffirm the Order's dedication to the sanctity of human life. It is to the Blessed Mother that we turn in prayer as we work to end the Culture of Death that grips our society. As we think in terms of 'One Life, One Rose,' it is most appropriate that we turn to Our Lady of Guadalupe who made known her will through Juan Diego and the miracle of the roses."

Today six Silver Roses travel through North America exemplifying Knights of Columbus devotion to Our Lady and commitment to the Culture of Life. In 2015, one Rose begins in British Columbia and heads south along the Pacific coast before turning east on a winding path through the southwest and mountain states before reaching Texas. A second rose starts in Alberta and heads east to Saskatchewan before entering the United States in North Dakota and travelling through the northern US Rockies and the Great Plains on its way toward Texas. A third rose starts its run in Manitoba, moving south through the central United States and along the Mississippi before turning to Texas. A fourth Rose begins its journey in Ontario moving through the Midwest and some of the Mid-Atlantic States before ending in Washington, D.C. A fifth Rose begins in Virginia and journeys throughout the south on its way to Texas. A sixth Rose starts in New Brunswick and travels throughout the northeast, completing its journey in Connecticut. The program ends on Dec. 12, 2015, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

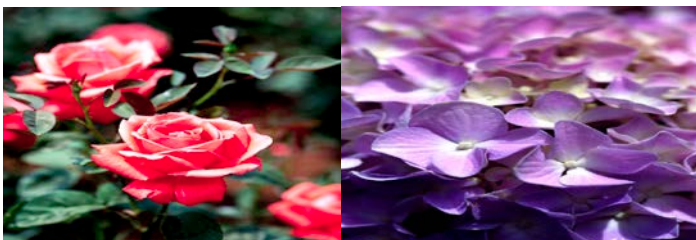
