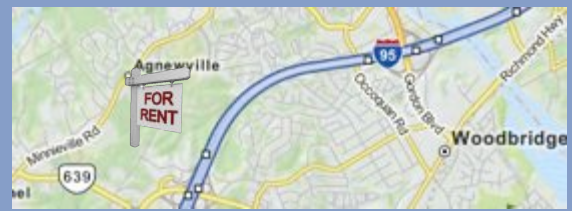

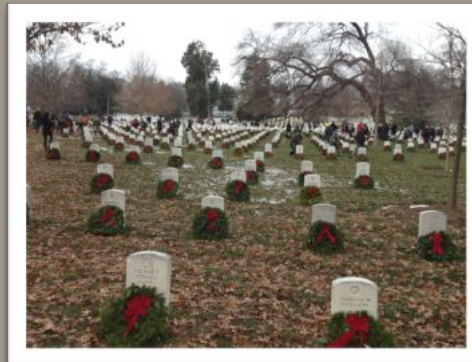

## Baby Who Doctors Declared Dead Comes to Life After Placing Her on Church Altar

A little girl who doctors declared dead after she was born prematurely has come back to life after she was placed on a church altar. Brazilian media indicate Yasmin Gomes was born prematurely at 2.6 pounds this month and stopped breathing soon after and they declared her dead and issued a death certificate. Jenifer Gomes da Silva, Yasmin's mother, said, "My world crashed down right then. It was the most desperate moment when all my dreams were snatched away."

A nurse Ana Claudia Oliveira, asked hospital officials to send the baby's body to a local church instead of the hospital morgue, and church authorities placed the baby's body on the church altar. Three hours later, the baby came alive.

The nurse assisting with the pregnancy, Ana Claudia Oliveira, decided against shipping the infant off to the morgue, so she had Yasmin dressed in a burial gown and placed her in the chapel because she was a "little angel."

"I can assure you, the child was dead. Her pupils didn't respond to light. All her signs pointed to the complete absence of life," said Oliveira. "I saw it with my own eyes. She was blue all over, completely dead. After unsuccessful attempts to bring the child back, Doctor Aurelia Filipak said what happened next was unlike anything he has seen in his 20 years of medicine.

Elza Silva, grandmother of Yasmin, was on her way to the chapel in order to transfer her presumably dead granddaughter to the morgue when, in her eyes, a miracle took place. Yasmin, who was pronounced dead by doctors just three hours before, opened her eyes and began kicking.

"At first I couldn't believe it, we couldn't accept that it could happen," Silva explained to Brazil's Globo G1.

"Then we saw that she was breathing. We hugged each other and started to shout, 'she's alive, she's alive.'"

When Oliveira stopped to consider medical explanations, she decided there were none — simply put, it was a miracle.

## Pancake Breakfast Benefit – Sunday, December 8<sup>th</sup> A Best Choice Mobile Ultrasound and Pregnancy Resource Center

The proceeds for December's pancake breakfast of \$400 benefitted A Best Choice Mobile Ultrasound (A Best) unit. A Best saved their 1<sup>st</sup> life in January of 2013. Here is an excerpt from their newsletter:

*"We were blessed with our amazingly successful 1st case using a temporary ultrasound through Tepeyac in Fairfax, which they allowed us to use until we received our ultrasound in January 2013. The mother, who was referred to us through a sidewalk counselor, came to us as abortion-minded. Her reasoning was that the baby would just "go to heaven anyway" and she simply could not afford another child. We drove her to the RV as she didn't have the transportation and we spent time listening and counseling, then ultimately performing the ultrasound. Through the initial counseling we showed her pictures of 7-week-old fetuses and she was clearly in awe and amazed. She never had been shown pictures of a baby in early development and never realized how well formed they were at only 7 weeks! She then revealed to us that she did have an abortion years ago and the abortion center never revealed this truth to her. This is a purposeful oversight of abortion centers NOT to reveal anything that would remotely explain that they are carrying a baby. We were relieved that she is now aware of the truth and after showing her the ultrasound that cemented the reality even more. She beamed with excitement and mentioned how eager she was to show her picture to friends. We continue to follow up with her to this day and she thanks us for our support."*

- **Birthright of Woodbridge** helps women through unplanned pregnancies by providing pregnant women with counseling, pregnancy tests, legal, medical and educational referrals, prenatal information, maternity and baby clothes, housing referrals, social agency referrals and adoption information.
- **Disaster Relief** for victims of natural disasters this year in the Philippines and the Midwest.

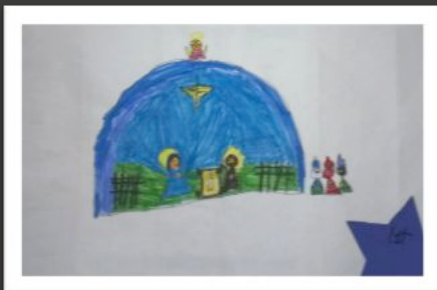
# Keep Christ in Christmas Poster Contest St. Thomas Aquinas Regional School
