

# Over \$5,600 Raised by 10 Pancake Breakfasts

The pancake breakfast is a foundation in our council; on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of the month. By offering a hearty breakfast from a nominal price (\$5 for sausage, eggs and hash browns, pancakes, coffee/juice), we were able to raise funds to benefit parish and community organizations. By raising funds for these groups, we further enabled them to carry out their unique missions to our community and parish.

The four Our Lady of Angels parish groups were St. Vincent de Paul Society, Catholic Youth Ministry, March for Life bus and the Aquinas Tuitions Angel Program. Each group also contributed volunteers to take part in the cooking, setup and clean up. Thank you. The council assisted with the sponsorship of parish busses to the March for Life.



What an additional joy it was to have the sisters attend our breakfasts. We are looking forward to our final breakfast for the year, benefitting Aquinas on June 8<sup>th</sup>, 2014.

One of our pillars of being knights is to

support the culture of life within our Faith. One breakfast benefitted "A Best Choice Mobile Ultrasound Unit" here in northern Virginia. They have become a well-known provider of emotional and material assistance to women distressed by an unplanned pregnancy. They have saved lives without a doubt! By us knight participating in the breakfasts with our families and by us knights working the benefits, we have been able to further promote these organizations and develop fellowship among our parishioners.







#### Bingo is our council's single most important fundraising activity. Period.

We provide entertainment with chances to win cash prizes event every Sunday afternoon for anyone in our community who wishes to attend. (Once in a while Brother Omar will provide song and dance during intermission.) Admission is \$20 with options to purchase other games like Progressive, Jackpot (\$1,000) and the ever-so-silent Quickies.



Pull-tab sales account for most of each session's deposit as bingo card sales generally break even. "Love to Win" and "Ultimate Derby" are weekly favorites among our players. On average 85 or more persons are in attendance. The council now has purchased a couple of used pull-tab counting machines to make the job more efficient.

So what does bingo do for us as a council? Bingo deposits for

the previous 10 months are over \$80,000. From that we maintain the council/bingo hall and grounds, pay its utilities and pay for all bingo supplies (cards, pull-tabs, machine and board maintenance – anything bingo-related.) This is totaling over \$62,000. The remainder is available for charitable giving as directed by a majority vote of council members in attendance. This fraternal year we have donated to our seminarians, to our selected ultrasound initiative, the March for Life, Our Lady of Angels altar servers scholarship, Virginia Knights of Columbus Charities, Inc., KOVAR, Fr. Bader Scholarship Program and numerous other charities in our community and Order.

We invite all brothers to participate in bingo. We have 5 teams on a five-week rotation. Teams arrive at the hall around 10:30 to setup for the event. Many players arrive at this time also to pick out their favorites seats. Pull-tab sales start at 11am and card sales start at 11:30am. The 1<sup>st</sup> game is called at 1pm. Participants receive a fantastic lunch from Kelley's Kitchen. Bingo ends at approximately 4pm and participants are welcome to stay afterwards for fellowship in the council lounge.



## All Saints 5-car Raffle

Last fraternal year the council voted to take on the raffle, as it is an important fundraiser for the parish. The results this year ended satisfactorily as over 6,400 \$5 tickets were sold. Generally the parish receives approximately 60% of its sales.

Our council provided the initial contact to All Saints, the planning, communication and administration of the all-important "envelope stuffing event", transportation and mailing of the 4,000+ envelopes and the receipt, counting and depositing of the funds. In the end the council also did the final transport of the ticket stubs and parish check to All Saints.

The 5750 Food Crew provided a buffet breakfast and lunch to all of the parish volunteers who stuffed the envelopes and verified their contents. This was not a small task. There were over 40 volunteers. It took 3.5 hours to compete the task. Everyone had fun.

Thirty-five runners were registered and additional runner arrived for same day registration. (Two bandit runners ran with the registered runners.) This was the Council's 1<sup>st</sup> race. The team proved that such a big event could be planned and executed flawlessly. We ended up in the black and used the funds to donate to a local pro-life organization helping pregnant women in the Woodbridge, Virginia area.

Our council makes some of the best gourmet hoagies available for sale in northern Virginia. They are sold after weekend Masses for the World Series and the Super Bowl. We sold over 500 hoagies at each event. The proceeds from the sales provide the council funds for our charitable giving. Over \$4,500 was raised from the sales.

We purchased a professional grade slicer from <a href="www.publicsurplus.com">www.publicsurplus.com</a>. Now we have two slicers which make the cheese and meat slicing process go so much faster.









#### **KCIC Poster Contest at Aquinas**

In our society, Christmas has become for many - especially children - a secular holiday. To combat this, the Knights of Columbus has introduced the Keep Christ in Christmas poster contest. This program allows young people to engage their creative talents and imaginations while understanding the true, spiritual meaning of Christmas.

This was the first year of the contest and the first time our council held a competition at Aquinas for the students. Over 60 children participated. First place prize in each age group was \$50; 2<sup>nd</sup> place prize was \$25. The winners moved to district-level competition and won. A number moved to the state competition and won. Two students won top honors - International winners!


## **Memorial Mass & Dinner**

Thank you Brother Grohoski for the coordination and execution of these events. It was a terrific success and the Council looks forward to future Corporate Communions.




#### **OLA's Patronal Feast Celebration - August 2, 2013**

The Father Edwin F. Kelley Council 5750 sponsored 5 youth (Brother Komla Kudiabor's daughter Cecilia was one) to attend Camp Joshua in Virginia during the weekend of July 20<sup>th</sup>, 2013.



Camp Joshua was new to most of us. It is a three-day or weekend camp designed to train high school students to be pro-life leaders now and in the future. It covers all the basics of the pro-life issues in classes and hands-on workshops. Just as Joshua brought down the walls of Jericho, the young men and women of Camp Joshua will lead their generation in bringing down the walls of the culture of death. They will Be Joshua to our world in need.

Camp Joshua is part of the <u>Life & Leadership Camps Initiative</u>, a nation-wide pro-life program developed by <u>National Right to Life</u>, <u>Louisiana Right to Life</u>, and <u>Wisconsin Right to Life</u>. Camp Joshua Virginia is a project of the <u>Virginia Society of Human Life</u> (VSHL).







## From the Financial Secretary

Council 5750 began the Fraternal Year (July 2013-June 2104) with 214 Members, 79 of whom were Insurance Members. Among the 214 were 40 Honorary Life Members and three Honorary Members. As of the beginning of June 2014, we have 219 Members, 78 Insurance Members, 40 Honorary Life Members, and four Honorary Members. God called one of our members, Brother Joseph J. Woods, to eternal life on January 29.

I wanted to share with you some information pertaining to the 5750 Club Inc. The 5750 Club Inc. exists primarily to protect the council from any liability. The corporation owns and manages our building.

Because the building is deemed as a charitable building by the state of Virginia, we are able to use bingo funds to run and maintain the building. The corporation's

core members are the current grand knight, the deputy grand knight and the 3 trustees. In addition, there are 4 other members-at-large which are elected from the council to serve for 2-year terms. Every year we elect two of the four members at large to serve for a two-year term. This allows us to keep the terms of the 4 members at large staggered.

As you can see by the make-up of the corporation, the best interests of the council will always be protected. This past year, we focused on building our corporation bank account while making minor improvements and conducting regular/routine maintenance on our council home. I would like to take this opportunity to publically thank PGK Gill Autmon for his tireless efforts in maintaining the building. As you may know, Gill leaves town for several weeks at a time to manage properties outside of this state. When he arrives back in Woodbridge, he volunteers as a cashier for bingo every Sunday and spends countless hours working maintenance issues on our council home. His effort have not only benefited the council, but he has made my life a heck of a lot nicer since he volunteered for building manager position last year... THANK YOU GILL!!!

Getting back to our corporation account, we currently have over \$46K in our account. Approximately \$5K - \$8K of this amount is for rental deposits, but the rest belongs to the corporation. Our strict fiscal policies between the council and the corporation have allowed us to get to our current financial status, which is very good. We are financially sound enough to absorb a major financial setback; such as an air conditioner replacement.




